We note that Section 1, Box 9 and Section 2, Box 11 in respect of trust funds have both been answered 'No', the smaller authority has confirmed that it does not act as sole managing trustee for trust funds, and thus the responses should have been 'N/A' and 'N/A' respectively.

The date for Section 2 has been incorrectly recorded on the AGAR. The minutes of the meeting at which the AGAR was approved have been reviewed and demonstrate that Sections 1 and 2 have been approved in the correct order. The smaller authority should ensure that the dates are correctly recorded on the AGAR in future.

The smaller authority has not provided an answer to our query regarding the variance between the prior and current year values in Box 3 of Section 2 and so we have been unable to tell whether this is adequately explained.
