Deposit accounts available from Lloyds where we can earn interest on savings over £10,000. Their two current offerings are a 32 Day Notice and Fixed Term deposit account. The 32 Day Notice Account has a current rate

of 0.65% gross/AER (variable) whereas the Fixed Term Deposit has interest rates from 0.15% to 2.3% gross/AER. Details in email sent to councillors 3/10/22

Council discussed putting the CIL money to the currently unused account. This was proposed by Cllr. Ford and seconded by Cllr. West. However, Cllr. Blundell counter proposed to put 60% of the CIL money into a new '32-day notice' account and the remaining 40% into the existing, currently unused bank account. Seconded by Cllr Gough. All agreed.

Youth Club – grant request further to email update from Dave Brown. The grant request of £2,994.75 was declined on this occasion as the accounts look solvent already and the bank balance was healthy in March. Cash flow forecast to be requested. However, council agreed that leader Dave Brown is doing a great job with youth club, especially with the litter picking around the playing fields so a gift of £50 was proposed by Cllr. Blundell and seconded by Cllr. Muns. Dave has been invited to attend the next meeting to give an update on details of the grant request.

	The Zip wire trolley braking mechanism is now ordered and will be sent directly to our installer, Steve Alpin. The manufacturer suggested that we should also replace the finger guards on the overhead trolley. Mr. Alpin confirmed that the mechanism looked worn and should therefore be replaced. This has added some £38.42 (ex VAT) to the overall cost of parts. The parts come to £506.10 (ex VAT) and Mr. Alpin is quoting £524.00 (ex VAT) to carry out the work, which was already agreed at the last meeting.	
	Stepping Stumps - John Ford and Cllr. Blundell will be setting these new stumps in place on 10/10/22.	
	Deer Signs & New Recreation Signs  Anthony of Barefoot Signs made the required amendments on the signs for the Recreation Ground that comply with the relevant British Standards. The total cost, already agreed, is £155.21 (ex. VAT) for the Rec. signs plus £100.80 (ex. VAT) for the deer signs; one should add the cost of necessary screws, bolts, plates etc. to attach these signs to a variety of surfaces, including chain-link fencing.	
	Seating for the older children Emily Muns has asked if we could add some seating down by the equipment for the older children.: - "Either several benches clustered together so people can sit - maybe a few benches in a U format - or benches side by side so you can be social and chat - there are often groups of 8-10 parents sat on the grass, so I guess encouraging that interaction to continue if possible or feasible." "This Kaiser & Kraft Park bench made of plastic, with 13 slats, width 2000 mm, moss green costs some £267.00 (ex. VAT) + six floor anchors for £39.00 (ex VAT), delivery is free. It looks sturdy & won't rot. Two, or three of these would be suitable". However, the council did not agree to this due to security concerns.	
	Platinum Jubilee Tree Purchase of the tree, a sturdy metal tree guard and a means of protecting the base of the guard. Cllr. Blundell suggested 3 options regarding the tree guard:	
	Tim Neville – Metal Dreams Blacksmith £500	

	Blackcountry Metalworks offer a sensible two stone high, circular surround. Their large guard is 20" in diameter & 5' high. £147.33 excl. VAT	
	Paddock Fencing produces their large Guard at 2'6" x 6'6" to help prevent damage to the young Quercus Rubra. £350 excl. VAT, therefore £420 incl. VAT. – this option proposed by Cllr. Gough, seconded by Cllr. Muns. All agreed.	PB/Cle
	The late Queen's Green Canopy – a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee. The Plaques are made of high-quality Corten steel. The recyclable material forms a natural protective layer of reddish-brown rust over time to protect against the elements. These plaques come from the RBLI. We agreed to link to the above tree project.	РВ

	NHP Group The group had met on 26th September with their consultant who had produced a pictorial map showing the villages divided up into Character Areas to allow for further discussion and definition for inclusion into the Character Appraisal for the plan review.
