Cllr Muns will summarise and present at next meeting. Risk Committee and Community Resilience. Clir West had submitted report to Parish Council prior to the meeting. Meeting dates need to be regularly set and Cllr Muns agreed to volunteer to help on this committee. West Lavington Village Hall – Cllr Gough reported that they now have a cleaner. New bin has been delivered, albeit smaller. No update to ClO. Hirers are increasing. Cllr Gough thanked Gaile Bishop and Paul Bryant for the work they do supporting the running of the hall. Rights of way Cllr Laister reported that some footpaths are overgrown and that he and Cllr Ford will identify the landowners concerned. Two trees that fell during the storms have now been cleared. Enquiry from horse rider regarding concerns of accessibility of a gate opening mechanism on WLAV4. Clerk to forward this to Clir Laister then report back to the enquirer. Cllr Ford thanked residents for keeping some of their nearby paths clear. Playgrounds Group – Meeting dates need to be regularly set and clerk to set date for the next meeting in consultation with Cllr Blundell. Speedwatch report and Speed Indicator Devices (SID) update This is now proactive – 10 vehicles were caught speeding last Sunday. Two sites have now been confirmed by the Highways engineer for the two SIDs i.e. A360 near Rutts Lane, and near 46 High St, Littleton Panell. Clerk has received an email from a concerned resident regarding speeding. Clerk to reply advising on the installations of the two new SIDs and inviting him to join the Speedwatch group. NHP Review Group - and response to NALC re Local Plan Consultation from DLUHC Cllr Gamble shared our Neighbourhood Planning Consultant's comments with Wiltshire Council and will chase them for a response. 26 Sept meeting for 'Local Plan'
