#### Dear Friends,

Many people have suffered and continue to suffer because of on-going economic crisis. It is heartening to hear of someone who managed to turn his financial misfortune into a real blessing for others.

John Kirby was born and bred in Yorkshire. For 13 years in worked in the finance industry. Then he lost everything: 'My marriage was over,' he recalled. 'I ended up destitute with two small children aged seven and four, all living in one room.' He describes those dark days, 'I felt so guilty and incredibly ashamed that I'd had so much and blown the lot. The stresses took their toll on my marriage; over the next year I gradually fell apart. I was a completely broken man.'

Hounded by debt collectors, John celebrated Christmas with bacon sandwiches. However he fought his way out of this financial pit. He met some Christians; 'There was something about them, something I didn't have,' he said. That led to John finding faith himself.

Sitting in his office, John decided that he wasn't going to pursue a career in finance any more. 'I wanted to help the poor – but had no idea how, or the price we'd have to pay,' he remembered.

Now with a fresh vision, John set out to assist people who were just as he had been. Starting off with a £10 note in 1996, he met his first client who was suicidal. John realised that he could relate to this despair. Creating budgets for food and essentials, John did deals with creditors and empowered people to look after their own finances. He not only offered people help, but also the Christian message of hope.

'Christians against Poverty' (CAP) is now a thriving organization. offering free debt counselling in the community; it has more than 200 UK centres. Their work has enabled thousands of people to become debt-free. They can be contacted at www.capuk.org

for carers in Wiltshire. A useful website for

carers is www.carersinwiltshire.co.uk It is a charity which offers support, information, advice and break opportunities to unpaid carers.

Carers are entitled to a Carers library card. This means you can have books for six weeks instead of the usual three week loan. Carers and those people they care for are also able to have the Home Library Service. This service is provided by volunteers who will work with library staff to deliver particular books, talking books and DVDs of interest either fortnightly or monthly at a convenient time to the carer's home.

The Blue Badge Scheme (formerly the Orange Badge Scheme) provides considerable parking concessions for people with severe walking difficulties who travel as either drivers or passengers.

Many GP surgeries in Wiltshire offer regular FREE Health Checks especially for carers. It's a chance for carers to have routine tests done such as blood pressure and cholesterol. Being a carer often takes up a lot of time and can often have an effect on your health so having a routine check-up could be beneficial to you. #### **NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING TEAM**

#### **Recent Incidents**

The current priorities for the South Rural Neighbourhood Policing Team will see us focusing our efforts in Worton. We have taken reports of theft and drug offences and will be carrying out regular patrols of the area and stop searches where required.

Our previous priority was speeding along the B3098 where we carried out a total of 33 speed checks, resulting in 15 motorists being advised and one motorist receiving a speeding fine.

Recently suspicious activity was reported to us from Littleton Panell, whereby overnight on April 1st unknown suspects have marked two properties along the High Street with a cross. It is not known for what purpose although it could be suspected that this could identify properties to be burgled or potential theft of animals. The crosses were promptly removed by the occupants.

#### Cold Calling

Cold calling is increasing and some heavy pressure sales tactics are being used to sell products, especially in the area of Home Alarms. Trading Standards and the Op Liberal National Team are looking at a number of companies who are acting fraudulently in the area reducing the number of cold calls which will inevitably reduce the number of offences.

Unsolicited (cold) calls and mail are not only a nuisance, but can also lead to pressured sales and sub-standard goods being sold at premium prices. To avoid unsolicited sales, calls and mail in the future you should remove your personal details from any sales lists. This can be done by registering with the Telephone Preference Service This is a free service.



#### EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH A Good Walk

We are blessed to live in a beautiful part of the country. Gentle hills, flat valley plains, patchwork quilt fields, stately flowing rivers and bubbling streams. A bit of coastline would be nice, but Wiltshire can't have it all. The county has some great countryside walks. Just lately the wife and I have taken to wandering along the Kennet and Avon Canal towpath. From Semington to Devizes and from Bradford on Avon to Dundas are a couple of our favourite walks.
