Dear Friends,

I came across the following piece written by a Vicar 60 years ago:

This time of year makes us all feel better. The winter has been long and hard, but the beauty of the spring flowers, the splendour of the trees and the green lushness of the meadows bring new hope and joy and make us feel better.

But the change that the coming of spring makes in us is small compared with the change produced by the message of Easter. The knowledge that Christ rose from the dead should make an indescribable difference.

As an illustration of this influence, let us recall the following true story.

Bernard Reichel, the great conductor (1901-1992), was rehearsing his choir for a production of Handel's Messiah. The chorus had come to the point where the soprano solo takes up the refrain 'I know that my Redeemer liveth.' The technique of the soloist was perfect – faultless breathing, accurate notes, splendid enunciation.

When the final note died away, all eyes turned on Reichel for his look of approval. Instead he silenced the orchestra, walked up to the singer with sorrowful eyes and said quietly, "Do you know that your Redeemer lives, do you?" "Why, yes, I think I do" she replied. "Then, sing it," the conductor replied. "Tell it to me, so that I know, and all who hear will know that you know the joy and power of it."

Then he motioned to the orchestra to play again. This time the soloist sang the truth as she knew it, and had experienced it and all who heard wept under the spell of it. The old master approached her with tears in his eyes and said, "You do know, for you have told me."

The knowledge of Christ crucified, but risen from the dead, left its mark on her song. We may not be professional singers, but the resurrection of Jesus Christ should influence our daily task, if we really believe it. We need that influence in our industrial, economic and social life now as never before, if we are to resurrect our national life. We have had a long winter, but Easter is with us, and Easter means hope.

Amongst the challenges and heartaches – and the joys – of life, that hope is ours too today!

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN – COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

The 'headline' results of the questionnaire are set out below – thank you to everybody that responded – 62% of all households! These results provide a preliminary indication of the concerns, hopes and aspirations of the community on the basis of individual perceptions and opinions. The full results can be seen on the parish website www. westlavington.info/planning.html or by calling in to either the Costcutter shop or the Doctor's surgery for a copy.

The next step will be to identify demand and opportunities in West Lavington and Littleton Panell before a detailed set of proposals, taking note of the comments made in the returned questionnaires, can be offered to the community for further comment in the form of a draft Neighbourhood Plan (which will include site allocation proposals for development).

Please be aware, however, that this next step has become complicated by the fact that, since the questionnaire was prepared, Wiltshire Council has been obliged to increase the number of houses required in the emerging Core Strategy for the county and must bring forward the review of settlement boundaries. In order to meet these requirements, Wiltshire Council will now itself be seeking to identify more development sites. However, its timetable may pre-empt that required for the Neighbourhood Plan.

It is too early to know how these requirements may affect West Lavington and Littleton Panell, if at all, but it is expected that Wiltshire will consult with local communities on its own proposals in the coming months.

The Parish Council considers that it has a responsibility to make use of the work achieved so far and to meet the community's expectations. It will, therefore, seek to work collaboratively with Wiltshire Council and to ensure that our community-led Neighbourhood Plan process continues. So, to the Headlines! Of those that responded:

- 85% **VALUED OPEN COUNTRYSIDE, SETTING & VIEWS and 54% VALUED LOCAL CHARACTER**
- 70% SAY THE PLAN SHOULD ALLOCATE LAND FOR ADDITIONAL HOUSES
- 46% THINK THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING
- 64% THINK THAT 'SMALL FAMILY HOUSES FOR SALE' SHOULD BE BUILT
- 40% THINK THAT 'APARTMENTS OR SMALL HOUSES FOR YOUNGER PEOPLE' SHOULD BE IN THE MIX
- 38% **CURRENTLY THINK THAT UP TO 20 HOUSES SHOULD BE BUILT** OVER THE NEXT 10 YEARS, AND 26% UP TO 40 HOUSES
- 61% THINK THAT THERE ARE ISSUES WITH VOLUME AND SPEED OF TRAFFIC, AND 53% SAID THAT PUBLIC TRANSPORT DID NOT MEET THEIR NEEDS FOR EMPLOYMENT OR LEISURE
- 74% SAID THAT LOCAL FACILITIES ARE ADEQUATE FOR THEIR NEEDS

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

For most of us, I suspect, one of the joys about living in a lovely village or a house in the country is the relative tranquillity. In addition, in this part of Wiltshire, I think most of us know at least some of our neighbours and enjoy the friendships that go with being part of a community. It seems to me that, in our rural communities, there is a remarkable number and variety of activities in which we can participate if we so wish.

Of course, for some of us, a local shop or post office or pharmacy may not be immediately nearby but many of our material needs can be ordered by phone or via the internet and deliveries can be made to our door. Alternatively, a short car ride can take us to Devizes or Westbury or Trowbridge or Melksham or even Salisbury where, in every case, shopping can be a delight (with apologies to towns I have not mentioned). So what's not to like? Well, for a few, life in a rural area may not be so easy. For example, social housing is in short supply, so if you want your growing family to live nearby, and they can't afford to buy, then until now there was not much you could do about it. I'm pleased to say, however, that Wiltshire Council is proposing to give local connections a much higher priority in housing allocations, so it should soon be easier for local families to live in the area where they have grown up.

It's also challenging out here if you are looking for a job and you don't drive. It is hard to get to a place of employment by bus, and subsidised bus services are under threat in these challenging times. Concessionary bus pass holders may also fear for the survival of bus services and I have asked government to consider allowing a small charge if this would allow threatened services to continue.

Young people in their teens or twenties can also be isolated from the activities enjoyed by their peers in towns, especially in the evenings. Cycling on our local roads is not for the fainthearted and I have an ambition to improve safe rural cycling routes where possible.

For the sick or frail or elderly, a doctor's surgery visit let alone a trip to hospital can require planning and the assistance of a friend or neighbour. I applaud the wonderful services provided by Care & Link volunteers in this regard.

For individuals and families in need, therefore, rural life can be tough. Treasure the pleasures that our lovely area can offer, but remember those for whom the isolation can be difficult.

Our annual Parish Meeting is scheduled for **Friday May 16th at 7.45 p.m**. in the Village Hall. At this meeting we will be bringing you up to date with the Neighbourhood Plan, and all the village organisations will be invited to present their annual reports. It will be an interesting evening so do try to come along.

Lastly, a word of warning - the tick season is upon us. Those tiny blood sucking insects, no bigger than a poppy seed, that live in brush and long grass are ready to attack both humans and pets. When returning from a walk do check yourselves, children and pets. Bites on children tend to be above the waist. The incubation period for Lymes Disease, obtained from the bites, is 28 days, so if you have been bitten and you develop flu-like symptoms or a bulls eye type rash around the area do go and see your GP. Prevention is better than cure though, so long sleeves and long trousers are sensible clothing when walking in the fields.

We started our meeting with a reminder to plant a few extra seeds, keep a few extra bulbs when dividing them, heverells or to save some cuttings for the Garden Club Plant Sale which will take place on 31 May.

Our speaker for the April meeting was Don Everitt. As

Don has been lecturing to garden clubs for over 40 years, we felt certain that he would give a polished performance. And we were not disappointed. His topic was Fascinating foliage. And fascinating it proved to be.

We are inclined to take foliage for granted. But it plays a vital role in our environment. Leaves take in carbon dioxide and give out oxygen. Grasses are grazed by domesticated animals that we then use as a food source. We use the leaves of vegetables for food. And we use the leaves of herbs to flavour food. Tea is made from dried leaves. And some leaves are used for various potions and lotions because of their medicinal qualities. Leaves are used by some societies in building or for clothing.

Having got us thinking about the myriad uses of leaves, Don moved on to discuss the use of foliage in the garden. He pointed out that flowers tended to be there for short seasons and therefore their foliage tended to provide the point of interest for most of the year, and eventually provide the backdrop for the flower display. So plants were chosen both for their foliage and their flowers. The shape and colour of leaves also played an important role in garden design. Large leaves can provide shade and the microclimate in which other plants thrive. Some foliage can be clipped into interesting shapes to add sculptural interest in the garden. Scented foliage can be used to stimulate the senses. And leaf mould provides a wonderful mulch and makes good compost.

The talk was enhanced by colour slides and little anecdotes. Don had brought along a selection of plants for sale to our members. Judging by the brisk sales it was clear that people had found the talk inspiring and were going to look at the foliage in their gardens with fresh eyes.

The next meeting will be on Tuesday 13th May. We will meet in Great Cheverell Village Hall at 7.15 for 7.30 pm. We will then visit a selection of local gardens to see what some of our fellow garden club members are getting up to in their gardens. Please remember to wear sensible footwear. 

EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH

In a recent article David Cameron spoke of the need to 'infuse politics with a greater sense of evangelism'. He said, 'If we pull together, we can change the world and make it a better place.' Evangelism is not a programme of social reform, although it may have beneficial effects upon society. Utopian programmes that have attempted to change the world by human effort have invariably ended in failure. Witness the collapse of Communism that led to the end of the Cold War. The Gospel is not about our efforts to put things right. It is that Jesus died for our sins and rose again so that those who believe in him might be forgiven and put right with God. That is what puts the evangel in our evangelism.

The scheme is run by local communities' charity Community First.


