

Dear Friends,

I was asked today – 24th August – "Did you have a nice holiday?" I wouldn't describe moving one's mother after 64 years in the same house exactly as a holiday. It is not something that I will ever do again, that is for certain.

Having filled up a hired van yesterday with all the things from the house that our family are keeping, I closed the back door behind me - only to discover that the keys I had in my pockets were not the right ones and that every set of keys was inside the house! Youthful memories of shinning up a ladder and getting into the house via the upstairs loo window were frustrated by possibly wiser but certainly less adventurous members of my family; the arrival of an expensive 24/7 lock-breaker beckons after attempted entry with an old credit card at 6.15am failed.

The episode reminded me how important keys are, what a significant part they play in our lives. Who hasn't lost a set of keys at some stage, yet at the end of the day they are only pieces of metal?

In our Gospel reading this morning we heard Jesus say to Peter, "...on this rock I will build my church...I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven..." (Matthew 16:18-19). Those of us with a firm Christian conviction would say that the <u>key</u> to life is Jesus Christ, that he provides hope and purpose in life that nothing else can.

For those of you who aren't familiar with it, The White Horse Challenge is a sponsored walk over two days raising money for the Wiltshire Air Ambulance. It is 55 miles long, and takes in the White Horses of Alton Barnes, Pewsey, Marlborough, Hackpen. Broadtown, Cherhill and Devizes.

We know the route off by heart now, only referring to the walkers' notes occasionally. The scenery is stunning! Absolutely beautiful! And when you're walking along the Wansdyke at 7 in the morning it is SO SO quiet! Conversation between us rarely stops. Constant discussions about what we are going to eat next, who will be at the next checkpoint, our kids,



sweets, politics, work, soreness of feet on a scale of 1 to 10 and back to food again! We completed the 55 miles in 19 hours - 8 hours on the first day and 9 on the second. Not bad, we think, for two women who hadn't done ANY training at all.

If any one wants to have a go next year, it's usually the first weekend in July. It's great fun, well organised and the Marshall's are fab! We'd thoroughly recommend it. After all, when you see it flying overhead to an emergency, the Air Ambulance is such a good cause.

ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO August 1914

When war was declared on 4th August 1914, many men from the Lavingtons were already serving in the Wiltshire Regiment. The 1st Battalion was stationed at Tidworth, and the 2nd Battalion was stationed in Gibraltar.

The 1st Battalion received their orders to mobilize on 4th August and immediately began their preparations for war, which included musketry drills and range practises, route marching, and inoculations against typhoid. There was also a church parade.

On 13th August they left in two trains, the first carrying 505 men and equipment departed at 7.22am, arriving in Southampton at 11am. They had some difficulty loading the vehicles on to the SS South Western, as they had to remove all the shafts and wheels from the wagons in order to get them through the hatch. All the horses had to be boxed and slung, and it wasn't until 4.30 pm that the troops embarked. They sailed at 7.15pm, but anchored in Sandown Bay.

The second train, which left Tidworth at 9.12am, containing 509 men, arrived in Southampton at 10.45. The troops embarked on the SS Princess Ena at 2.30pm.

They arrived in Rouen on 14th August, and on 16th August they travelled by train to Aulnoye. They then had several days of marching, during which they received an ecstatic reception from the inhabitants of Avesnes, where they were loaded with flowers.

On 22nd August they arrived in Ciply. German planes passed over them as they arrived, and the next day, they were ordered to dig trenches to the north of Ciply and facing Mons. They were shelled by the enemy until nightfall, but they continued to entrench throughout the night. The Battle of Ciply began on 24th August and the Wiltshire's suffered their first casualties. A captain and three men were killed in the trenches, and 20 men were wounded. The Commanding Officer's horse was shot from underneath him.

The men now had some indication of what lay ahead, but they were probably still optimistic that they would be home for Christmas.

The 2nd Battalion received orders to return to the United Kingdom, from where they sailed to Zeebrugge on 5th October 1914. They were destined for the trenches at Ypres.

Over the next four years I hope to give a regular monthly report of what the men from our villages were doing a hundred years ago.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

At a personal level, you may agree that relationships between partners should be a private matter. How the different members of a family get on together is generally not a subject to be discussed in public.

At a national level, however, family affairs are a matter of concern to us all. When a marriage between nations has been long and successful, the possibility that one partner may seek divorce is significant.

England and Scotland joined together in 1707. The couple had been engaged for over 100 years since the Union of the Crowns in 1603 and the intervening century had not been without incident but, by the early eighteenth century, the partners were ready for union and wedding vows were sealed willingly by the respective parliaments.

The early years of marriage were not without some problems, notably the Jacobite Rebellions of 1715 and 1745, but for most of the following three centuries the two countries have got on together pretty well. Indeed, there is probably no family of nations in history that has been more successful than the United Kingdom, Irish independence notwithstanding. The extended family of the Commonwealth continues to be the envy of much of the world. Even the rebellious child America, which stormed off in a huff in 1776, remains on good terms.

Three hundred years of marriage have bonded Scotland and England pretty closely together. Business links are deeply entangled. For example, our local electricity supplier, Scottish & Southern, is headquartered in Perth. South West Trains is part of Stagecoach, also based in Perth, while First Great Western and First Bus are headquartered in Aberdeen. Standard Life is Scottish, as is much of Lloyds Bank group and almost all of RBS.

Our former MP. Michael Ancram, is a Scotsman and now holds the title of Lord Lothian. James Gray, MP for North Wiltshire, was born and brought up in Glasgow and is the son of a former Moderator of the Church of Scotland. Personally, many of our friends and neighbours in Wiltshire are Scottish born and some of our closest English friends now live in Scotland.

Militarily, the countries of the United Kingdom are mutually dependent. Financially likewise. Disengaging Scotland from the UK will be challenging to say the least.

Council The referendum for Scottish independence is on 18th September. If the voters in Scotland chose Yes, the implications of the subsequent divorce will be momentous. I sincerely hope that a much-loved member of the UK family will decide to stay.

BOOKMARK

In July, still reeling from the long winded and complicated Luminaries, we found our subsequent novel. The Goldfinch by Donna Tartt also a mammoth read - but one which the group thoroughly enjoyed. The story begins with a tragedy at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in Manhattan – leaving a



13 yr old boy in possession of Carel Fabrities' painting 'The Goldfinch'. Because we felt this dark, but extraordinary, work of fiction would also benefit from editing (especially the Las Vegas & Amsterdam scenes) we only awarded 9 marks out of 10. All agreed this was a memorable novel which thoroughly deserved to win this year's Pulitzer Prize, but wondered if there was any value to be found in stretching modern fiction over 800 pages!

In contrast, Katherine Stansfield's *The Visitor* is set in Cornwall's Skommow Bay (Newlyn?) between two time frames, 1880 & 1936. The relationship between fishing communities and the sea feature strongly in this debut novel, as do the role of women in the earlier period and tourism in the latter. This novel was deemed to be atmospheric and visual with a strong structure; the group score given was 8 out of 10.

Several members chose to read The Sunday Times best seller, Alan Johnson: a Memoir of a Childhood for our biography/classic session in August. This vivid portrait of a bygone era appealed to all and is now a well thumbed paperback doing the rounds of our nearest & dearest. Andrew Marr's, A History of the World was found to be a fascinating, though unfinished read and the BBC's, Frank Gardener's Blood & Sand was considered an 'eve opener' on the rise of Islamic Fundamentalists in the Middle East. Two members read Clare Balding's My Animals and other Family; one found the book a light, warm and natural read; the other thought it boring. That's Book Club for you! And finally, Daphne du Maurier's classic, *Hungry Hill* was deemed a bit of a thorny read. We meet again at the village hall (7.30 p.m.) on Wednesday September 17th to chew over The Aftermath by Rhidian Brook and Margaret Forster's The Unknown Bridesmaid. New members always welcome.
