Dear Friends,

In the immediate aftermath of the horrific series of attacks in Paris and the very real threat of more, many people are fearful; violence and bloodshed seems to have reached a new level — with younger, liberal westerners being targeted in the Bataclan Theatre.

Nearer to home, there seem to be a lot of people at the moment even in these five villages who are suffering from life-threatening illnesses — cancer in particular.

Add to this the increasingly frenetic December that many of us will be leading, and one is left with a growing longing that something better would emerge.

At the heart of the Christmas message is that 'God so loved the world, that he sent his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life' (John 3:16). God's plan for the human race was to send someone to bring hope and purpose to individual lives in a broken and hurting world.

Jesus often spoke to his worried hearers by encouraging them 'not be afraid'. Before he left his disciples, he consoled them, 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid' (John 14:27).

In uncertain times, when fear stalks, the baby in the manger who became the man who lived and died for each one of us so that we might be reconciled with the Father and know deep inner peace is an increasingly attractive prospect for many around the globe.



WEST LAVINGTON PARISH COUNCIL Neighbourhood Plan Consultation

West Lavington Parish Council is holding a community-wide consultation on the first draft of its Neighbourhood Plan: **OUR PLACE: OUR PLAN**. It began on November 21st 2015 - with delivery of Consultation Leaflets door-to-door - and will run until January 16th 2016. An open public meeting took place on November 28th at the Village Hall.

The Consultation Leaflets contain questions on a range of proposals on **future development** in the parish **over the next 10 years.** These include numbers of new houses, site options and policies set out in detail in the Draft Plan itself.

They also invite your views on a legally required environmental assessment. A Scoping Report prepared by an independent environmental planning consultant engaged by the Parish Council aims to ensure that any proposals for development are appraised in the light of their potential for harming the environment and to minimise impacts on natural resources.

The first Draft Plan (with annexes including the Environmental Scoping Report) is a large document. It can be inspected in printed form in Devizes and Market Lavington Libraries, Courtyard Surgery, The Churchill Arms and The Bridge Inn. Online it can be downloaded from the Parish Council's recently relaunched website at our new website address: www.westlavington.org.uk.

Please make your **replies** to the Consultation Leaflet on the "**Have Your Say – Your Response Form**" inserted in the leaflet.

Completed Response Forms should be **left at the village drop-off points**: Costcutters, Courtyard Surgery, The Churchill Arms and The Bridge Inn in the response boxes provided.

The consultation closure date is January 16, 2016.

Your replies will provide guidance for proposals to be made in a Final Plan on which a formal local consultation and a referendum will ultimately take place organised by Wiltshire Council. If you say yes, with 51% or more in support, then the Plan will have statutory force.



ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO

There were no local casualties in December 1915, In fact the different battalions of the Wiltshire Regiment were variously occupied. Whilst Division 5 were at Gallipoli, 7th Battalion were in Salonika and the 6th Battalion were working (without celebrating) in the trenches.

The 1st Battalion were stationed in the trenches, having to wait until the New Year to celebrate – which they duly did. Luckiest of all at that stage were the 2nd Battalion, resting at Auteuil. Their day began with Communion, then a Church Parade and finally a "sumptuous feast" of chicken, beef etc. It was followed by a Regimental concert, concluding with the National Anthem and three cheers.

LITTLETON PANELL COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

Update on speeding vehicles.

During the month of October the Littleton Panell Community Speed Watch team spent a total of 32 man hours checking the speed of vehicles through the village with the following result:

- 1. 60 vehicles were checked travelling between 36 and 40mph
- 2. 19 vehicles were checked travelling between 40 and 44mph
- 3. 5 vehicles were checked travelling over 45mph
- 4. 1 vehicle was checked travelling at 50 mph

Details of all these vehicles have been passed to the police for appropriate warning/enforcement action. If these drivers travel at these speeds even when they can clearly see a group of individuals wearing high visibility tabards then we can only wonder at how fast they go normally.

It's 30 for a reason

The difference of a few miles per hour can so easily mean the difference between life and death. The faster someone is driving, the less time they have to stop if something unexpected happens.

The risk of death is approximately 4 times higher when a pedestrian is hit at 40mph than at 30mph.

We have had a further 3 requests (1 from West Lavington) to become members of our Speed Watch team and I want to thank the existing members for all their dedication throughout the year.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Christmas is coming. It's the season of goodwill, and all that!

Except, as I write this, the mood is not exactly festive. The terrorist attacks in Paris have taken place and, for the time being, the f-word is fear, not fun. Dozens of families will have to get through the holiday season without their loved ones.

Such was the scale of the murderous outrage that I am sure it will still be in the front of our minds when you are reading this. Feelings of helplessness and impotence in the face of that malignancy may remain.

There are precedents to such events. 22 years ago the IRA exploded an enormous bomb in Bishopsgate, destroying a part of London where my wife and I had both worked until only a few months before. Life in London carried on and now there is peace, more or less, in Northern Ireland.

In the 1970s the Baader Meinhoff group and the Red Army Faction conducted a series of terrorist attacks in West Germany. Remember them?

In 1913, the suffragettes exploded a bomb that partially destroyed Lloyd George's house, yet now we look rather kindly on Mrs Pankhurst.

No one now has even heard of the Sheffield Outrages, a series of explosions and murders by a small group of trade unionist militants carried out in the 1860s. They had a just cause in objecting to conditions in the steel industry but took their actions a little too far.

None of this makes the current situation any happier but I hope history allows us to put current events into context. The wartime message resonates now: Keep Calm and Carry on.

If you were wondering what to give to your gardening friends for Christmas it seems that tomato ketchup, malt heverells vinegar, and barley straw would prove to be practical gifts. At our November meeting, Ray Broughton shared with us some 'Topical tips and new ideas'. He proved to be a very

accomplished and engaging speaker.

We learned that tomato ketchup when smeared over secateurs or other cutting implements serves to clean, sharpen, lubricate and sterilise. So if you happen to be visiting the Cheverells and glimpse what appears to be the aftermath of a massacre in someone's garden shed, please do not be alarmed!

Soaking poppy seeds in malt vinegar helps to break their dormancy and improve germination. You can sow potatoes shallowly in flat ground and then heap a ridge of barley straw over them. The potatoes are easy to pick by hand out of the straw mound.

Herewith in brief a few more things that we learned: it is the dying flowers of tagetes that produce the chemical that keeps whitefly off your vegetables and so you should not dead head them; some ladybirds can kill 120 aphids a day and you can buy ladybird eggs to scatter in May; white flowered varieties of runner bean are wind pollinated and therefore more reliable at producing a good crop than the more decorative but insect pollinated and thus weather dependent red flowered varieties; snipping the stigma out of your tulip flowers makes the flower display last longer; hosepipes when they get warm can give off a chemical which damages seedlings; there is a way to make pong free nettle or comfrev fertiliser involving fleece, aquatic stone and vermiculite; greenhouse plants can get a bit leggy in spring if they need carbon dioxide and a big dollop of horse manure wrapped in cling film with six puncture holes will provide a steady and smell free supply.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 8 December. A short time will be devoted to an annual review. After that we will have a bit of a party, with food, quizzes and camaraderie, to get us in the mood for Christmas. Meet at Great Cheverell Village Hall at 7.15 for a 7.30pm start.

Our first meeting in 2016 is on Tuesday 12 January. Ruth Gaddum, an RHS accredited Garden Designer, will give a talk entitled 'A pot full of garden design'.
