#### Dear Friends,

This month sees events to mark the 800th anniversary of the Magna Carta. It is of particular interest locally because of the existence of one of the four original copies in Salisbury Cathedral. The Diocese of Salisbury is marking the occasion by a pilgrimage from Old Sarum – the site of the original Cathedral – to the Cathedral on 14th June.

The Magna Carta was sealed under oath by King John on 15th June 1215. Since then it has been foundational for the preservation of liberty and the rights of the individual against tyrannical power by the State. No less than in King John's time, our world is dominated by powers and principalities that need to be held to account.

Just last week (15th May), the retired High Court Judge Sir Michael Tugendhat highlighted attempts by atheistic militants to silence Christians. He pointed out that a series of legal blows to the rights of Christians during the past decade had proved that human rights laws did not guarantee protection for believers to speak up for their faith. In his experience, judges have repeatedly found that equality laws have trumped the views of believers.

One of the latest examples was the case of the BA check-in clerk Nadia Eweida who was told by the airline that she could not wear a cross. Her case against BA was rejected by the British Courts, but the European Court of Human Rights eventually ruled that she had been discriminated against.

The spirit of the Magna Carta remains as relevant today as it ever did.

He attended Dauntsey's School as a Day Pupil before, at the age of 18, moving from the village, not returning until a few years ago when he became a resident at Dauntsey House, where he is much loved by all who have come to know him.

To celebrate his special day he was invited to Dauntsey's where he was given a "grand tour" ending with tea in the Headmaster's Study. Our picture shows him in company with a Scottish Piper who visited Dauntsey House to celebrate the land of his mother's birth.

#### ONE HUNDRED YEARS AGO

#### Charles Pike killed in action 16.6.1915

Charles was born about 1887 in West Lavington. His father was John Pike, a gardener from Wilton, and his mother Eliza came from Suffolk. The family moved around a bit, but were living in West Lavington from about 1886 to 1890. They then settled in the Swindon area.

Charles enlisted into the 1st battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment and arrived in France on 18th May 1915. The battalion was then at Elzenwalle in Belgium, and having a relatively quiet time, according to the war diaries.

On 15th June the battalion marched to trenches on the Menin Road, and arrived there about 11.45pm. At 2.50 am that night, the British artillery commenced a bombardment on the german trenches. At around 9am the Germans began bombing heavily. It was during this action that Charles was killed. He has no known grave but is remembered on the Ypres Menin Gate memorial.

#### George H W Griffiths killed in action 22nd June 1915

George was born in 1866 in Handsworth, Birmingham. His father was George Griffiths, a barrister, and his mother was Emma Lucy Harvey.

In 1903 George came to West Lavington. He was certainly in the village in 1906 when he married Alice Riddle Burgess. Alice was the daughter of Ebenezer Burgess, who was described as a pathological painter. He must have been quite successful as the family seem to have lived in reasonably affluent circumstances.

George joined the 25th battalion of the Royal Fusiliers. They embarked at Plymouth on 12.2.1915, bound for East Africa, and they arrived in Mombasa on 4th May 1915. The Battalion was part of a Force in Africa which defended British Colonies from German Colonial raids mostly focused in the areas around Lake Tanganyika, British East African and German East African territory.

The first major battle to involve the Frontiersmen was Bukoba in June 1915. The British objective was the destruction of the Bukoba wireless station. Due to Bukoba's location on the shore of Lake Victoria, it was decided that the raid should take the form of an amphibious assault. The raid was launched from Kisumu in British East Africa on June 21st 1915. Amongst the units chosen for the attack were the Loyal North Lancashire and the 25th (Frontiersmen) Battalion, Royal Fusiliers, more commonly known by the their nickname the 25th 'Frontiersmen'. Upon reaching the objective at Bukoba the attackers were accidentally landed in a large swamp and were pinned down by fierce rifle and machine gun fire from the German positions. Finally managing to escape the swamp, the British force was then held up by snipers—who succeeded in stalling the attack until a Captain Meinertzhagen advanced towards them and opened fire, killing one and driving the rest away. The attack continued for a further two days in the town; however, casualties were light on both sides. The Frontiersmen took the town on June 23rd. An Australian member of the unit, Lieutenant Wilbur Dartnell, climbed to the top of the town hall and removed the German Imperial Ensign from the flagpole as a symbolic gesture of victory. George was killed in action on 22nd June 1915, and is buried in Dar Es Salaam Cemetery.

In the Devizes constituency, the turnout was over 71%, which is the highest since the election of 1992, nearly a quarter of a century ago. If a high participation rate is a good thing, then perhaps the health of our democracy is improving.

Another statistic of interest is that nearly 58% of the voters in the Devizes constituency supported the winning candidate, which is the highest proportion since 1935.

The democratic process, by definition, is competitive. In some ways it can also be confrontational but the same can be said of the legal process (criminally accused vs prosecutor, civil litigant vs defender) and to some degree, the planning process (applicant vs objectors). It is a reflection on civilisation if these contests are conducted without rancour. As far as I could tell, the interchange in this area between the protagonists in the General Election was almost unfailingly polite, which I think reflects well on our community and our society.

Having selected our representatives, we may, from time to time, need access to them so that they can deal with our personal issues. In the case of our MP, we can write or seek a personal meeting at one of the regular surgeries.

At county level, there are other opportunities to take an active part in the process of government. Full Council meetings, Cabinet meetings and most committee meetings are open to the public, who can usually speak if they wish. Locally, there is easy access to elected members (including me) through the Area Board, which meets every two months.

The next meeting of the Devizes Area Board is on Monday, 27th July. Doors open at 6.00 p.m. and the proceedings start at 6.30 p.m., usually going on until 8.30 p.m. It's too soon for me to confirm the location or the agenda but there are normally a number of topics of interest. Details will be published on http://devizes.ourcommunitymatters.org.

#### **WEST LAVINGTON PARISH COUNCIL**

Stagepost demolition: As reported earlier on the Parish Council website, some immediate neighbours of the Stagepost and other residents had expressed concern that asbestos might be present in the large pile of rubble left on the site by contractors acting for the owners in the demolition of the rear function room and outbuildings

Following referral of these concerns by the Parish Council to Wiltshire Council, a Health and Safety Inspector from the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) inspected the site. He has advised that there is evidence to suggest that there has been low level asbestos on site (for which a licence is not required in order to remove it - for instance, cement sheeting/quttering) and that, although it has not been removed as well as it should have been, there is no significant contamination and the risk to the public from this is negligible and is no greater than from the normal background level. He will assess the inside of the remaining building but since the access to this area is secure, he will address this area during his further investigations/actions. He has also liaised with Wiltshire Council's Building Control Team and access to the site has been secured.

Stagepost planning: The Town and Country (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 allows a public house (Class A4 'Drinking Establishment' Use) to change to a shop (Class A1 'Shops' Use) without the need to obtain planning permission. The change of use is 'permitted development' and the Local Planning Authority is unable to intervene. However, whilst a change of use may not need permission, any external building work associated with a change of use may still require planning permission.

Unbeknown to the Parish Council, the owners of the Stagepost obtained a "change of use" from a pub to a shop earlier this year. A factor in their favour was that they do not intend to demolish the main building. However, their application to make alterations to the outside of the building will be subject to consideration by the Parish Council at its June meeting in the usual way.

At the time of my writing, Wiltshire Council reports that it has no information on any potential future occupier of the site.

Streetscene: The first step of the newly formed and named Lavington/Panell Streetscene group - to replant Hooks Court frontage with plants that will lend colour and enhance the setting - has been completed. A tidy-up of weeds growing in the pavement along the High Street in Littleton Panell has also taken place and the street does now look much better. It is hoped that householders with properties on the High Street will be encouraged by this clean-up and now look to help keep their own frontages weed-free! Further planting will continue along the street as soon as planters ordered arrive. heve are five things that you need to get right in order to 'get the most out of your vegetable plot'. At our May meeting he listed these and then, using colour slides to illustrate his talk, he explained how and to what extent you could influence the yield.

Firstly he explained how important it was to have the right soil structure. The crumbs of soil need to have a good network of spaces between the particles within the crumb. And between the crumbs you need to have a good network of spaces to allow drainage. The spaces within the crumb hold moisture. To achieve a good structure you need to dig the topsoil. It has been found that crop yield can be improved 95% by digging the subsoil too because the roots can find more water. If you do not walk on your vegetable beds or leave them bare during heavy rainfall you can get away with a major dig every six years. Mike has six vegetable beds and does a major dig on one bed each year. If you have 4 foot wide bed with walkways either side you can reach the rows, if they are parallel to the walkways, without walking on the bed.

Ensuring that your crops receive the correct amount of nutrients is the second way to achieve good yields. Different vegetable crops require different amounts of each nutrient. For instance cabbages require a large amount of nitrogen but peas do not.

Water has a big influence on yield. Mike advised that gardeners should have a rain gauge. By measuring how much rain has fallen you can calculate how much more water you need to give at critical phases of the plant development. When plants are producing flowers or fruits they need more water to achieve optimum yields. When potatoes produce flowers they are beginning to form the tubers and so need more water to increase yields. If you overwater root crops such as carrots and radishes they will produce lots of leaf and less root. It has been proven that applying water two weeks before harvesting increases the yield.

Getting the spacing between plants right was Mike's fourth way of influencing vegetable yield. Studies have proven that there is an optimum planting density. For example it is best to have 8 onion plants per square foot and for beetroot 10 to 12 plants per square foot.

You can also improve the yield from your vegetable plot by cropping sequence. As soon as one crop is harvested you can plant another with a different growing season. And by not having bare soil you can keep weeding to a minimum.

On Tuesday 9 June we have a visit to the garden at Windmill Cottage in Market Lavington, a one acre cottage style, wildlife friendly garden. There is a charge of  $\mathfrak{L}1$  for members and  $\mathfrak{L}3$  for non members. 
