MAGDALEN COLLEGE OXFORD CHOIR'S ADVENT CONCERT AT EDINGTON

On Saturday 10th December, Edington Arts will host the renowned choir of Magdalen College, Oxford for a concert in the Priory Church of Advent Music across the centuries. Mulled wine and mince pies in the interval! The concert starts at 7.30pm.

The choir is one of three originally established by Statute at Oxford University in 1480, ensuring that there would always be a choir to sing services. The 32 choristers – 16 boys and 16 men - are now internationally recognised as a 'five-star' choir. They perform all over the world, have appeared at the BBC Proms, have done a number of orchestral collaborations including TV and film soundtracks, and have recorded a number of CDs.

The College's Assistant Organist, Alex Berry, is directing the choir this term for all its many concerts, pending the arrival in January of the College's new Music Director. They will be accompanied by organ scholar William Fox, and will sing music composed for Advent (and Christmas) across the centuries, from the 16th to the present day. Palestrina, Byrd, de Victoria, through JS and JCF Bach, Stanford, the fabulous Fantasia on Christmas Carols by Vaughan Williams, Joubert, Biebl, Matthew Martin - some ancient music is given a modern twist, while some of the new music is in the ancient tradition. You can hear examples of the music on offer by visiting www.edingtonarts.org

. The choir's vivid tone, artistic chemistry and authority promise an evening of rare beauty.

Tickets are selling very fast; there are by now only a few front nave and rear nave tickets left, though there is good availability at the sides. Prices in advance are £20, £15 and £10 with 18 and under coming free; if you buy on the night you will need to add £2 per ticket.

END OF AN ERA

As many of you will already know, Blood Doning sessions, which had been held locally for many years (over 35 but I am hoping somebody will let me know exactly!), will no longer take place in our villages.

Improvements in clinical and surgical practice, and the Blood Services' own efforts to ensure that blood is used appropriately, means there has been a fall-off in demand for blood from hospitals in recent years. The sessions are therefore carefully planned so that only enough blood is collected to meet patient need and they have reduced the amount of blood collected by consolidating the number of sessions offered to donors. To make the most effective use of resources (in turn lowering costs to hospitals), sessions have been moved to larger venues, where greater numbers of donors can attend.

I know that a lot of you (and the Team and me) are disappointed that our sessions in West Lavington Village Hall, the old hall and more recently the Community Hall in Market Lavington have ceased, but I would like to say a very big "Thank you" to all those of you who supported the sessions: the donors of course, but also the many tea-helpers over the years and all the local shops and businesses who were happy to put up a poster

I hope that you will continue to give blood - if you are invited to attend a session, it means they do need your "pint", so I hope to see some of you in Devizes, or Melksham, or Westbury or! Remember you can book appointments online and find other venues on www.blood.co.uk

100 years ago

Our villages bore a heavy toll during December 1916 and January 1917 with five servicemen losing their lives. It is worth noting that the Great War was not confined to the trenches. Besides the Casualty in France, the other three died from battles in Iraq and Africa

Lance Corporal Charles Potter 11973 Died of Wounds 25th December 1916

Charlie Potter was born in Market Lavington about 1885, the son of Harry Potter, a shepherd from Tilshead, and his wife Catherine Ellen. Charlie enlisted into the Wiltshire regiment on 30th September 1901 and served with them in India from 1902 to 1909.. In 1911 the family was living at New Farm, Gore Cross.

Charlie would have been involved in the battle of Mons, the battle of Marne, the battle of Aisne, and the first battle of Ypres in 1914. In 1915 his battalion was involved in the battles of Aubers and Loos. During 1916 he was fighting on the Somme, where he was wounded and he died of his wounds on Christmas Day 1916 at Dernancourt Casualty Clearing Station.

2nd Lieutenant Ernest James Dutch Died of Wounds 6th January 1917

Ernest was born in 1881 in Great Cheverell, the son of James Dutch, and his wife Louisa Snelgrove. James went to London with the Holloway brothers, and worked as a master carpenter and as a manager, living in Battersea.

Ernest joined King Edward's Horse. He received a commission in January 1916 and transferred to the 25th Battalion of the Royal Fusiliers as a 2nd Lieutenant.

After capturing the coastal capital of German East Africa, Dar es Salaam in September 1916, General Jan Smuts ordered his army's advance to halt owing to a malaria pandemic that had devastated the soldiers. Shortly after the New Year, the 25th Frontiersmen Battalion, led by famous hunter and explorer, Captain Frederick Selours advanced into the interior of the colony. When Selours was killed, leading his men, Ernest Dutch immediately took over command, but he was also shot and seriously wounded. He died of his wounds on 6th January 1917.

Private William George Baker 26384 Died of Wounds 22nd January 1917

William was born about 1893 in West Lavington, the eldest child of George Baker and Eliza Burden. George worked as a labourer, and he and Eliza had eleven children. When he was 17 years of age, William joined the 4th Wiltshire Regiment, and he served for a year in India from 9th October 1914. In January 1917 the battalion was in trenches in Mesopotamia. The battalion was engaged in the difficult task of digging and improving trenches. This was a difficult task under trying conditions, the ground being a network of liquorice roots. During this operation the men came under sniper fire. William probably received his fatal wounds during this time; he died on 22nd January 1917 and is buried in Amara in Iraq.

100 years ago (continued)

Corporal David Chard 11975 31st Died of Wounds January 1917

David served in the 5th (Service) Battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment. This was formed in Aug 1914 in Devizes as part of the First New Army .

In July 1915 the regiment embarked on the SS Franconia, headed for Gallipoli.

The regiment was involved in the second battle of Kut al Amara which began with a British attack on both banks of the Tigris on the night of 13th/14th December 1916. The British had suffered a humiliating defeat at Kut earlier in the war, but this time there were 50,000 men included in the advance.

It was during this battle that David was wounded, and he died on 31st January 1917. He was buried in the Amara War cemetery in Iraq.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

Plus ca change, plus c'est la même chose as the French might say. If you need a translation, it means "The more things change, the more they stay the same."

You may be forgiven if you suspect that I have been musing cynically about some of the remarkable events of 2016, such as Brexit and Trump.

In fact, my thoughts had been stimulated by consideration of a matter with a slightly lower public profile - music education. Not long ago, if the parent of a child in school wanted that child to learn a musical instrument, the school asked Wiltshire Council and the council provided a music teacher. The parent paid the school, the school paid the council, and the council paid the teacher.

That may sound fine, but the cost of administration to Wiltshire Council was significant. Government did not contribute, the music service was not a statutory obligation and many music teachers were outside the loop. To save money, did we walk away? No! Music education is important. In fact, we found a new way to do things.

The new arrangement is that music teachers are now independent contractors who deal directly with the school and the parent. The Arts Council has provided finance to confirm the credentials of every teacher and to support disadvantaged children. After one year, there has been no discernible change in the number of children learning music. Indeed, more disadvantaged pupils are being supported in a more targeted way. Not least, the vetting process is such that more teachers are being approved, so those who were previously outside the council employment structure are now accountable. The cost to the public purse is down by tens of thousands of pounds. So it's not so much la même chose as mieux (better)!

Music and Christmas are inseparable. Carols in church; Pop on the radio; Musak in stores and lifts -all contribute to the seasonal atmosphere. Government figures show that the UK's creative Industries, including music, are growing at almost twice the rate of the wider UK economy - generating nearly £10 million per hour.

So sing along and have a very happy Christmas!

The memorial has already received special attention by the parish. You will recall the rededication service in 2014 which followed the discovery, by our local historian Lyn Dyson, that three people with links to our villages who had died in WWI, were not remembered on the memorial, nor did they appear to be on a memorial elsewhere.



The Parish Council agreed to fund the addition of their names: Percy John Nash, James Harold Shore and William Hall. Descendants were traced and the rededication of the memorial took place on Sunday, 22 June 2014, the original memorial dedication scene of 1921 being re-captured for the 2014 occasion.

- **6.Defibrillator** the Parish Council agreed in principle that a defibrillator should be installed in the village. Cost details were discussed.
- 7. Footpaths The chairman had walked all the footpaths and found them to be generally in good order, with the exception of CHEM 9 where it continues from CHEP 5
- **8.New Road Signs** These have been installed. It is to be hoped that they will be effective in keeping HGVs out of Low Road

When we arrived for our November meeting we found the Village Hall floor piled high with foliage. Behind this pile stood our speaker Sara Gruzelier, armed with a pair of secateurs. As the evening progressed the pile was gradually reduced. At the end of the evening Sara departed with a

large bag of prunings. The audience had been given instructions about pruning , some useful tips and also a live demonstration of pruning in progress. We were asked at times to imagine that Sara's outstretched arm clutching a frond was a wisteria fixed to a wall. Then out came the secateurs and we were left with a well pruned (imaginary) wisteria. And later we had to imagine that an intertwined bunch of branches was a shrub that needed some central branches removed to allow air to circulate so as to prevent mildew or other fungal diseases from developing.

This evening of theatre was a refreshing approach to giving us a basic guide to pruning. Sara is a renowned garden designer. She also teaches trainee gardeners and runs pruning workshops. She claims to have learned about pruning by following closely behind the Wisley trained gardener who came a few times a year to do the pruning in her own garden, Pilgrim Croft.

Sara said that many gardeners are terrified of doing the wrong thing when pruning. This often results in them not pruning hard enough. Others just have a go and often overdo it. Sara offered us some good advice. She advised that we learn the names of our plants so that we could look up the pruning instructions specific to that plant. Then there were some rules of thumb that gardeners use. For instance, there are 3 D's for pruning namely, take out Dead, Diseased and Dying branches. Always clean your secateurs after pruning each plant and especially after taking off diseased branches. Never prune when it is frosty or there is going to be a frost as the open cut will suffer freeze/thaw damage. In general, anything flowering before the longest day should be pruned when it has finished flowering and anything that flowers after the longest day should be pruned in spring. Always remove branches that cross each other and rub together. And remove branches that overhang paths (unless you are deliberately designing a covered arch or tunnel). On some tender plants, such as fuchsias you need to leave the flowers on throughout the winter until April as the flowering branches help to protect the rest of the plant from the winter weather. When removing diseased branches you need to check the cut end to make sure you have removed enough.

There was plenty of audience interaction. Sometimes there was an audible gasp as an imaginary shrub was reduced to a short stump. Sara also took questions from the floor and gave people ideas on how to tackle their problem plants. Many of us have now added good secateurs and a good book about pruning to our Christmas list and are looking forward to pruning instead of dreading it.

Our next meeting is our Christmas party on 13 December.

Our first meeting in 2017 will be on Tuesday 10th January. It will be about pests and diseases. We have been invited to take photographs of our problem plants or the problem pests to bring to the meeting for discussion. Meet at Great Cheverell Village Hall at 7.15pm.
