DECEMBER REFLECTION FROM THE RECTOR

Inside out by Peter Trow. (pp141 CAFOD)

It is not hard to imagine the crowded inn. Friends and relatives have got together and seek to celebrate; the place is packed. Some who are weary are trying to sleep. The place is full to capacity. There is much conversation, perhaps some singing and dancing. There is no room here for Mary who is about to bring forth her son. There was no room at the inn.

How common these words are, though they may be said in different ways: "don't disturb me, I'm busy." "I would like to help but I don't have the time." "I like a routine and I don't want anything to interfere with it." Or "I can't come and see you I have business to attend to." And every time we excuse ourselves, we exclude ourselves from certain experiences. Being pre-occupied is a great defence against anything new happening.

"I would have said my prayers but there is too much happening to me right now." In such ways we risk missing the coming of God into our lives.

Yet the innkeeper, busy, hard pressed, found room. He offered a space to Joseph and Mary. Simple accommodation and into it came the Christ Child. The innkeeper made room and the Christ was able to enter into his place.

Amid all the busyness of Christmas, the activity that threatens to overwhelm us, the Church invites you to make room. To join in with any or all the festivities the churches of the benefice are offering this Christmas. To hear the story of a child's birth and rejoice with us that God comes, he comes into the world, he comes to me and he comes to you. So that all can rejoice in the mystery of the God who seeks to share in our daily lives. We celebrate the greatest of miracles that the Word is made flesh and dwells among us. Let us all give a moment to think over these words of St. John. "to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God."

So, from one child of God to another, May Christ our infant saviour give you the joy of the Bethlehem Shepherds, the awe of the worshipping sages and the humility and love of the holy family.

100 YEARS AGO

Sergeant Frederick H Collins 3/769 Died 1st December 1917

Frederick was born in Stert in 1867. He was the nephew of Richard and Mary Ann Collins of West Lavington, and was raised by them. Richard was a shepherd. He and Mary Ann had five children younger than Frederick.

Frederick first joined the army in 1886 when he was 18 years of age. He achieved rapid promotion to Corporal in 1890, Lance Sergeant in 1891 and Sergeant in 1892. He served in India from 1895 to 1898, at which time he had served his twelve years and was discharged. He did re-apply to join again in 1903, but bought himself out after only a month, for the sum of £18. By this time he was married to Frances Iles.

After his discharge from the army, Frederick and Frances ran the workhouse at Bradford on Avon. He was the master of the workhouse and Frances was the matron. They also had a daughter, Vera Margaret living with them there. She was born in 1907.

When the war broke out Frederick offered his services once again to his country, although he was by this time nearly 50 years of age. He was stationed at the Devizes Depot of the Wiltshire Regiment. He died there of natural causes on 1st December 1917. He was buried in Devizes with full military honours, and was the oldest soldier from our villages to be classed as a war casualty.

Lance Sergeant Samuel Phillips 18779 Died 7th December 1917

Samuel was born in 1896 in West Lavington, the son of James Phillips and his wife, Mary Carter. James was a market gardener in Littleton Panell. Samuel grew up with eight brothers and sisters and was working as a farm labourer in 1911.

We don't know precisely when Sam volunteered, or indeed whether he was called up. We do know he was attached to the 5th battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment, and that they were deployed to Mesopotamia (Iraq) in 1916.

For nearly two years, Sam would have been in the thick of the action against the Turks, including the Battle of Kut al Amara, the capture of the Hai Salient, The capture of Dahra Bend, The passage of the Diyala, The pursuit of the enemy towards Baghdad, Capture of Baghdad, Battles of Delli 'Abbas, Duqma, Nahr Kalis, crossed the 'Adhaim and at Shatt al 'Adhaim, The Second and Third Actions of Jabal Hamrin and at Tuz Khurmatli (29 April 1917).

Sam caught meningitis whilst serving in Mesopotamia. He was transported to India for medical treatment, but died there on 7th December 1917 at the Deccan War Hospital in Poona.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division

I feel there is an atmosphere of nostalgia at this time of year. The traditions of advent and Christmas are deeply resonant of times past. No only carols, but the music played in shops and on the radio is invariably the warm and familiar seasonal fare. If you have a log burning in the grate as you come in from the chill, the mood is complete.

Frosty mornings may help us forget the threat of global warming for a while, but other concerns of the modern world can make us yearn for the good old days. Well, maybe. I am old enough to remember the 70's. Let's look at a few of the current issues and compare:

- Trouble in the Middle East? The last king of Afghanistan was overthrown in 1973 (while I was visiting neighbouring Iran). The Iranian revolution followed in 1978/9. I don't think I contributed, but you may recall the subsequent hostage crisis.
- An American president with unconventional habits? Richard Nixon resigned in 1974 after impeachment proceedings against him for "high crimes and misdemeanors".
- Rising prices? Now 3%. Inflation peaked at 20% in the 1973/74 recession.
- Minority government? The February 1974 general election yielded a Labour minority government (which then won a majority in October 1974).
- Edgy relations with Europe? Labour pledged in its February 1974 manifesto to renegotiate the terms of British accession to the EEC, and then to consult the public on whether Britain should stay in the EEC on the new terms. The referendum took place in 1975. Plus ça change, you might say.

WEST LAVINGTON PARISH COUNCIL

Neighbourhood Plan Public Consultation 24 November 2017 to 12 January 2018

West Lavington Parish Council is again consulting on its **Néighbourhood Plan**. This is the first statutory consultation required and is taking place under Regulation 14 of the Neighbourhood Plan Regulations 2012. Included are the results of the recent **Housing Needs Assessment Survey** regarding affordable housing requirements in the parish. Very many thanks for the excellent 36.1% response rate achieved. The results of the survey have been incorporated into the Plan at Policy H1. They evidence an overall housing allocation of a minimum of 30 units to be built in order to meet the affordable housing need expressed in the survey. This is based on the 30% requirement of Core Policy 43 of the Wiltshire Core Policy. The results of the survey are set out in full on the Parish Council website as a supporting document to the Draft Plan. The Draft Neighbourhood Plan has built on the responses received from the 2015/16 informal

consultation on the first draft of the Plan and the final version will build on comments made as a result of this consultation. It contains four themed sections: Growth; Infrastructure, Services and Facilities; Built Environment; and Natural Environment. **Policies** are included within each section to guide the development and use of land. You will find that each Policy contains an introduction and explanatory text followed by the Policy itself in coloured text.

The methodology for arriving at 'site 7' (land south of Lavington Lane and north of DAPS) as the **preferred housing allocation** under Policy H1 is set forth in the supporting background document: Site Assessment Methodology, which can be found on the 'Planning' tab of the Parish Council website www.westlavington.org.uk. You will recall that, of the four short-listed site options under the first draft of the Plan, site 7 (now referred to as site H1(A)) received 68% of consultation respondents' votes as their preferred site for development.

Eight sites are designated for public consideration as 'Local Green Spaces' under Policy N1 of the Draft Plan. 'Green spaces' are sites the community would wish to see protected and where inappropriate development would not be allowed other than in very special circumstances. Proposals for development of any adjacent sites would need to demonstrate that they presented no harm to the setting and provide enhancement for people and wildlife.

Communities that draw up neighbourhood plans that secure the consent of local people in a referendum will benefit from a 25% **Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)** arising from development in their area. Otherwise the levy will be 15% only. CIL is focused on assisting delivery of community projects in the local area.

This will be the last time members of the parish community will have the opportunity to make representations on the policies of the Plan before Wiltshire Council arranges a local referendum. A majority of "yes" referendum votes will ensure its adoption and it will then form part of Wiltshire's wider statutory plan and will be used to determine planning applications across the parish.

My fellow Councillors and I wish everyone a very happy festive season.

During our November meeting Sally Nex, a freelance journalist, and accomplished speaker, gave us some heverells interesting behind the scenes anecdotes, insights and photos of the Chelsea Flower Show. At Chelsea three to four thousand journalists from home and abroad share

a marquee for the duration of the show. Sally said that she has learnt that the trick is for a journalist to turn up early each morning to secure the use of a locker and perhaps lay claim to a chair and some desk space for the day. The press tent is not always the safest place to be while the gardens are being built. One year a giant crane straddled the tent while building Dermot Gavin's exhibit and at times the situation appeared to be perilous. Sally described for us the year before each show. Once a designer submits a garden design to Chelsea there is little wriggle room for deviation from that plan. The designer employs a company to grow the plants and to source the materials and eventually to build the garden described. The average garden at Chelsea costs about £250,000 to build and the money is sourced from sponsors who value the publicity. Perhaps the most expensive garden cost about 20 million pounds as David Domoney used precious metals and diamonds and rubies and other gems in the display. Sally said that there was a good spirit of co-operation between exhibitors. They would even lend each other plants to complete a display. There are a few problematic sites on the showground, especially above an old Victorian sewer that is unable to take the weight of some of the materials. Each year designs have to be tweaked to avoid the collapse of this ancient but essential sewer. According to Sally the Chelsea pensioners have a marvellous time celebrity watching and posing with models for photographs and so are happy to endure the disruption once a year. Sometimes the appearance of a particular plant in a garden design at Chelsea can lead to spectacular sales of that plant for years to come.

In December we will reveal the new programme of events for 2018. It promises to be just as interesting and varied as the 2017 offering. Once again, we are holding the price of membership at just £8 per annum per person or £15 for a couple. New members are always welcome.

On Tuesday 12 December we will hold our Christmas party at 7.30pm in Great Cheverell Village Hall.

For our first meeting in 2018 on Tuesday 9 January our speaker will be Denise Plummer, the lady who writes the weekly farming column in the Gazette and Herald. The topic will be 'My Farming Life'.
