

The Easterton Country Fête will return in 2017 and be held on the 28th of August at the Village Hall and Fete field, with many of the same great attractions, stalls, traders and dog show that come together each year.



THE CURIOUS EYE Exhibition by local artist

Andy and Jane Wormell moved to Wiltshire 9 years ago to pursue their dream of setting up a smallholding and producing food in an environmentally friendly way. Part of the plan had been to free up Andy to continue his career as an artist. Andy had already undertaken commissions to do murals, carvings and paintings whilst living in London. In Wiltshire getting Andy back into the studio took longer than expected. But at last the couple have found a way to work with the cycle of the seasons, and Andy has dared to steal time to start making pictures, and to put together a body of work.

The Curious Eye is Andy Wormell's first solo exhibition since he moved to Wiltshire. Appropriately the show will be held in a polytunnel on the smallholding. Ultimately Andy would like to focus on the landscape but being a realist he decided to start with subjects that were close to hand namely the fruits and vegetables that he and Jane cultivate, the flowers they grow, and the wildflowers and grasses they leave to encourage the bees and butterflies.

His watercolours are delicate, carefully composed and closely observed still lifes of fruits, vegetables and flowers, He often runs a watercolour border round the image, and then allows the image to break through or under the painted frame, introducing a subtle tension into an otherwise 'still' life.

The oils in this exhibition are bold and bright and a joyous celebration of Nature's bounty. The objects are seen in close-up, sometimes cropped, and often in a square format which emphasises the decorative qualities of the vegetables, flowers and fruits depicted. These oils find the extraordinary in humble objects. They will brighten any home, and bring cheer, and memories of spring and summer on the darkest winter evening.

Andy is also a brilliant animal portraitist, and examples of his work, done to commission can be seen at the show.

The Curious Eye, a pop-up art exhibition, will be at Willow Farm, Blackdog Crossroads on Sat 29 and Sun 30 July, 10am-5pm. It is your opportunity to admire and hopefully acquire work by a local artist. There will also be information about art courses. Entry and parking will be free. Green Man Woodcrafts will have a display and items for sale. There will be some vegetables on sale too.

100 YEARS AGO

Private George William MacKinnon 25782 Killed in Action 31st July 1917 George was born in 1888 at Alton Barnes, a son of farm labourer William MacKinnin and his wife Ellen. They had a large family. In 1891 the family lived at Conock Down in Chirton; and In 1901 they lived at Great Cheverell where William was working as a farm carter.

George married Ethel Sainsbury in 1910. I have been unable to find George or Ethel on the 1911 census.

George served with the 2nd Battalion of the Wiltshire Regiment. At the end of July they were stationed near Zillebeke in Belgium, preparing to attack the German trenches that day.

By 3.40 am they were in the assembly trenches. It was still quite dark when they went over and they encountered a barrage and considerable machine gun fire; however they achieved their objective and captures the trenches and cleaned them out by 6.15am, taking about 40 prisoners. Further waves followed, meeting with varying opposition.

They maintained their position in the trenches all day, subject to heavy shelling. Sometime during this action George MacKinnon was killed. He is remembered on the Ypres Menin Gate.

In early 1918 George's daughter, Freda was born. Ethel didn't remarry; she died in 1977 at the age of 90.

So far as I can tell, Sheila M Judge came from the Isle of Sheppey and wrote several local history books for her native place. I think she also wrote a history of Easterton. I don't know what her connection with the village would have been.

If I have the right lady, she was born in 1920 and died in 2002 in Canterbury, I am pursuing that avenue of research, but in the meantime, if anyone can remember her or knows anything about her, I'd be grateful if you would contact me.

I think Sheila would be happy to have her work re-issued and I'm sure many of you would enjoy her book. It deserves a new audience.

If anyone has a copy of the Easterton book, I'd love to borrow that one too!! I could do the same with that one, with the profits to Easterton church.

But there is more. I am now Portfolio Holder for Arts, Heritage & Tourism. It is early days for me yet to know what that task will entail but, horror, I may have to visit some art galleries, some museums and some visitor attractions. It's a tough job, but somebody has to do it.

I don't need to tell you that there is nowhere more wonderful than Wiltshire and it is the job of the VisitWiltshire team to make sure the world knows it. They are an independent organisation supported in part by Wiltshire Council and linked to VisitEngland. Their website http://www.visitwiltshire.co.uk/ is regarded as one of the best in the country and I recommend a browse through. You may be surprised to find how much there is to enjoy on our doorstep.

Of course, our historical treasures and environment feature prominently but there are modern attractions too. As I write, VisitWiltshire is promoting the many wonderful golf courses in the county.

The effort seems to be working. We have about 18 million day visitors each year and nearly 2 million more who stay for at least one night. Tourism contributes about £1.5 billion to the local economy and supports nearly 30,000 jobs in the county, 10% of the total workforce.

You may think visiting our many attractions is nothing but pleasure but, for Wiltshire, it is serious business.

The Council met on 5th June, and will meet again on 3 July, after which it takes a wellearned summer break, meeting again on 4 September.

The Council's 2016/17 Accounts have been completed and submitted for external review. They are now open for inspection under the Exercise of Public Rights by any Elector of the Parish. This period lasts from 26th June to 4th August inclusive. If you wish to exercise this democratic right, please contact the Clerk.

Councillor Hazel Simons and the Clerk recently attended a meeting of Wiltshire Council's local Community Area Traffic Group (CATG), when the crossroads south of the village leading up to Salisbury Plain (Pear Tree Lane) was discussed. The problems of this junction were sympathetically discussed, and it is hoped that improved signage and cutting-back of overgrown verges will soon improve the sightlines, making it safer for

The Council notes that, now it's summer, hedges are getting very bushy and, in some cases, starting to obstruct the highway. There is a legal duty to cut hedges back under Section 154 of the Highways Act 1980. So you are politely requested to trim your hedges before Wiltshire Council is forced to do it for you, for which you will be charged. The Council will monitor this situation and, if necessary, write to specific house owners. The Council is also very concerned about the amount of dog mess in the village, particularly along Green Lane where children walk to school. It's unhygienic, unpleasant, and totally anti-social. So responsible dog owners (are there any other kind?) are again asked to 'bag it and bin it'. The Council takes littering in general, but particularly this issue, very seriously - if necessary, irresponsible owners will be named and shamed, and reported to Wiltshire Council which has the powers to levy a £1,000 fine. You have been warned.

The Council works hard to identify, and notify Wiltshire Council, of any potential highways hazards such as potholes. Recently, an elderly resident had a bad fall outside the Village Hall, where the payement is uneven. This issue is being pursued with Wiltshire Highways, but villagers are asked to be aware of the risks and to tread carefully.

On a lighter note, the Council is considering improvements and additions to the playground near the Pavilion, Witchcombe Close. If you have any suggestions, please contact the Clerk or any Councillor.

Scheme. It is situated in a beech wood hanging on the

way up to the Westbury White Horse. It is the culmination of nineteen years of design and hard work .The owners Colin Little and Penny Stirling are still bursting with ideas for new projects to continue the theme of the Chinese garden.

Inspired by a visit to the Doctor San Yat-Sen classical Chinese garden in Vancouver, this Westbury couple set out to emulate the style and create their own Chinese garden on the chalk slopes of Wiltshire. The result is a tranquil collection of garden rooms filled with colourful plantings and set against a backdrop of Chinese pavilions with flared roofs, Chinese gateways and statues. Winding paths lead from one room to another and each space and object seems to have a story and a symbolism. Demons or malicious spirits are thought to travel in straight lines so the paths have tight curves so that the demons cannot catch you. Irregular shaped rocks with holes in were highly prized by the Chinese and so are given prominence in the garden. The mosaic paths were designed by Colin and he designed and built the pagodas. In a new bamboo garden area is a wonderful mosaic by Colin depicting a panda feeding on bamboo. Chinese calligraphy symbols abound in the garden and the couple have even studied mandarin to ensure they can correctly reproduce the symbols.

Victorian gardeners introduced Chinese plants into English gardens and many of the plants and shrubs that we saw on our visit were familiar to us, such as peonies, climbing roses, bamboos, several species of gingko, and mulberries. There was a low canopy of greenery providing a dappled shade. Occasionally there was a gap in the canopy affording a borrowed landscape toward the distant Longleat estate.

For our July meeting we will be visiting Seend Head House Garden.

EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH DEMOCRACY, THE WORST FORM OF GOVERNMENT

For years to come pundits and political historians will discuss why the predicted Conservative landslide failed to materialise. Was it the unpopular Tory manifesto? The Brexit factor? The youth vote? Who knows? One thing's for sure, you can never be sure what the Great British Electorate is going to decide. Not these days anyway. Now we have a weakened government that faces the huge challenge of negotiating our exit from the EU on the best possible terms.

Democracy, eh? Winston Churchill once rather gloomily mused, "Many forms of Government have been tried, and will be tried in this world of sin and woe. No one pretends that democracy is perfect or all-wise. Indeed it has been said that democracy is the worst form of Government except for all those other forms that have been tried from time to time...."

Benign dictatorships usually end up malignant, corrupt and oppressive. The same goes for rule by a small group that cannot be held to account by the people they govern. Tony Benn suggested that five questions should be but to those in power: 1. What power have you got? 2. Where did you get it from? 3. In whose interests do you exercise it? 4. To whom are you accountable? 5. How can we get rid of you? Every system of government needs checks and balances to stop rulers abusing their powers. That is why in our system the government is held to account by parliament and is subject to the rule of law.

These checks and balances are necessary because as has been said, 'Power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely'. We might wonder why that is the case. Churchill gives us a clue in the words quoted earlier. We live in a 'world of sin and woe'. Human beings have a destructive tendency to mess things up spectacularly. We daren't give too much power to any individual because we are all sinners. That's why 'democracy is the worst form of government apart from all those other forms'.

Democracy can't solve the problem of sin, it can merely help stop it getting out of hand. But of one it is written, 'You shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins'.
