FROM THE RECTOR

On the 11th of July the Church celebrates the lesser festival for St. Benedict of Nursia, Abbot of Monte Cassino, Father of Western Monasticism and author of the Rule of St. Benedict. Almost all of what is known about Benedict comes from St. Gregory the Great's Dialogues book II. We are told he was born about 480 in Nursia, north-east of Rome and it was to Rome that his family sent Benedict to study. What he found there disgusted and horrified him. Unable to accept the worldliness of the city, and the behaviour of his fellow students, he decided to renounce his education, his family and his inheritance to become a monk. He first went to Effide and later settles in Sublacus. It was here, amongst wooded hills and cold streams, he found his "desert" and lived as a hermit in a small cave. With only a monk's habit, food and the occasional company, Benedict faced his demons so well that his holiness was recognised and he was asked to become the spiritual father of a near-by monastery. This was a disaster and the community, finding itself with a zealot for an abbot, attempted to poison him. Benedict withdrew for a short time before establishing twelve monasteries, each with its own abbot and twelve monks back at Sublacus. Unfortunately, tensions within Benedict and problems with a jealous and obstructive parish priest caused Benedict to move on. He finally settled on the mountain top of Casinum, known to us as Monte Cassino, where he established his community, wrote his Rule and remained until his death.

It was for the benefit of his monks as a practical guide to help them to live up to the vows they had taken, that Benedict wrote his *Rule for Monasteries*. The idea of a rule for monks when living in community was not new and Benedict drew on a much longer document known as *The rule of the Master* as well as other such documents. What Benedict did was to give a rule that was focused on God in all things; scripture based, lived in accordance with the example of Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Gospels and Apostles, and took into consideration human nature.

Benedict wrote his rule for his monks who lived together in one physical place, remaining solidly faithful to each other and to that place over a great period of time. This is one of the reasons why the rule is so pertinent to our lives today. We all live out our lives in "community." In fact we live as part of many communities: family, friends, marriages, church, workplace, sports clubs, pubs, neighbourhoods, towns and cities. So it follows that like Benedicts monks, we need to look at our interpersonal relations – how we should treat one another and conduct ourselves to promote peace and harmony within the many and varied communities that make up our lives.

And finally, one last thought from Benedict.



SPIRITUS EQUIS

Spiritus Equis was established in 2014 and is run by Clare Smallman with help from husband Mark and daughter Becks..... as a small team they offer equine assisted therapy. Together with mental health practitioners they provide help to those who may be suffering with anxiety or experiencing stress and family relationship issues.

Their workshops and sessions are tailored to meet specific personal or professional needs and provide a form of retreat where the simple act of bonding and interaction with the horses provides an opportunity to learn how to interact without the need for verbal communication in a more instinctive and intuitive manner.

Spending a short while in their company, whilst they conducted a session on a glorious Friday evening, gave an insight into what they do. Working with a group of children, who whilst not vulnerable or in need of counselling, clearly enjoyed the experience of grooming the horses and leading them through a simple obstacle course, without the need for coercion or control.



The process of bonding between the children and

the horses was a real delight to observe. Whilst it took some experimentation in how the children grouped themselves with the individual horses, they quickly overcame any initial discomfort, which the horses clearly sensed and ended with an obvious trust between the children and the horses.

It was easy to appreciate that creating the space and opportunity to step outside of an everyday and perhaps troubling environment to be faced with the responsibility for another living being must help build confidence and self assurance.

The simple joy and tranquillity of the experience also provides another coping mechanism and perspective when facing the difficulties of every day life.

Clare, Mark and their team offer both private sessions as well as full or half day workshops. They are currently offering a series of free workshops over the summer half term, sponsored by Youthnic, a social enterprise supporting young people. In addition, they are starting an after school club on Thursday evenings 4 – 5 pm in term time.



A VILLAGE ORGANIST A VILLAGE UKGANISI Forty five years ago last Easter, there was consternation at St Peter's Church in Great Cheverell because the organist had taken ill, and then someone thought to ask Gill Wilding. She

worshipped at the Chapel and had never played the organ, but she agreed to have a go. She practised in the afternoon and played for the evening service.

Then she played for the next forty four years and more, until a car accident last year. and subsequent ill health forced her retirement. In that time, she played nearly every Sunday and also for baptisms, weddings and funerals; through changes of Rector and churchwardens and two house moves as well. Month by month, her neatly written list of hymns appeared in the vestry and, week by week, the presiding minister was given the list of hymns for the service on a rectangle of card, probably cut from an old Christmas or birthday card.

For many of those years, her husband John, sat alongside the organ in the back pew, ready to slip across the aisle and tap Gill's shoulder. This was to remind her that the last verse of the hymn was coming up and singing harmonies in tunes such as Cwm Rhondda. His sad death did not stop Gill playing: she carried faithfully on.

She once did a sponsored playing of hymns in aid of the Church, but she can't choose a favourite - there are too many. She didn't just play hymns; we enjoyed a fine variety of music before and after each service and during Communion as well. We are glad Gill's health is now improving and she is getting ready for another house move into the recently built annexe beside her house. Everyone at St Peter's joins in thanking her and wishing her well.

100 YEARS AGO July 1918 Steele 304845 Kille

Petty Officer Stoker Charles Henry Steele 304845 Killed in Action 16th July 1918

Charles was born 27th March 1884 in Corsley, Wiltshire. His father was William Steele, or Still a farm labourer from West Lavington. His mother was Sarah Ann Baker, also from West Lavington. The couple lived in the village with their children Eliza, Hannah, and William before moving to Corsley, and then to Corsham where they lived at Byde Mill.

Charles joined the Royal Navy, and in 1911 he was serving as a Leading Stoker on HMS Kent in China and the East Indies.

In 1918 Charles was a Stoker Petty Officer, serving aboard HMS Anchusa.

HMS Anchusa was one of a fleet of mine sweepers designed to look like merchant ships. She carried two 4" guns and 2 2-pounder guns, officially designated the QF 2-pounder (denoting "quick firing") and universally known as the pom-pom. This was used as an anti-aircraft gun. The name came from the sound that the original models made when firing.

During 1918 the German u-boats sank 1035 Allied ships; the Navy was losing ships faster than they could be replaced. HMS Anchusa and 38 other vessels like her, were built very quickly and served as decoy ships.

HMS Anchusa was torpedoed on 16th July 1918 off the North Coast of Ireland. She sank with the loss of 79 lives, including Charles. His body was never recovered for burial.

Although the mythical land of Sodor may not usually be identified as Wiltshire, Awdry lived in the county as a child. He went to Dauntsey's School in the 1920s and the family house "Journey's End" was only 200 yards from the western end of Box Tunnel where the Great Western Railway kept an engine to assist freight trains up the hill. Those trains usually ran at night and the young Awdry could hear them from his bed. The first books, written in the 1940's for his son Christopher, were based on recollections of his own childhood in Wiltshire.

We tend to look back on the 20's and 30's as the golden age of rail travel. Steam trains still stir emotions today and I recently enjoyed a steam-hauled journey to Dartmouth in Devon which was packed with happy travellers.

Now, however, rail travel is even more important to the economy. More people use trains today in their daily lives than ever before and the number of journeys has doubled in the last 20 years. As a result, overcrowding is a major problem on some routes. Network Rail is investing huge sums in electrification (not always with ideal efficiency), HS2 seems to be progressing and train-operating companies are investing in new rolling stock. But no one should underestimate the complexity of the job and you may have noticed from the press that the recent introduction of new timetables has not gone smoothly in some places.

Locally, however, the prospects for rail travel are better than they have been for years. TransWilts is working with the Three Rivers Community Rail Partnership to provide frequent services linking Swindon and Southampton Airport via our local stations at Westbury and Salisbury and via a new station to be built at Wilton. Most excitingly (for me) is that discussions are underway to provide a new Parkway station at Lydeway to serve the Devizes area. From there, trains could run to London, Reading, Bristol, Exeter and beyond.

Devizes Station may still be a few years away, but we're travelling hopefully. Peep Peep!

Neighbourhood Plan Consultation - how to respond

You will have noticed posters on bus shelters and telephone poles throughout Littleton Panell and West Lavington, blackboards at the crossroads and Millennium Cross, a notice on the Parish Council noticeboard and on its website. Together with articles in News & Views and the Gazette & Herald, this all leads to the final public ('Regulation 16') consultation on West Lavington's Neighbourhood Plan coordinated this time by Wiltshire Council. It commenced for a period of 6 weeks on 11 June and will close at 5pm on 24 July.

You can view and comment from Wiltshire Council's website via: http://wiltshire. objective.co.uk/portal/spatial_planning/np/west_lavington_reg_16/west_lavington_ neighbourhood_plan_regulation_16_consultation or, alternatively, paper copies of the Plan and comment forms are available at Devizes and Market Lavington Libraries, the Churchill pub and Wiltshire Council Community Hall.

The final stage of the Plan process will be a Referendum organised by WC. Prior to that an independent examiner must produce a report of recommendations for WC to accept. There is still a fair way to go but the end is now in sight.

Volunteering

The villages of Littleton Panell and West Lavington are very fortunate. Footpaths are maintained, an emergency plan is in place, planning applications are monitored/ objections registered, residents are afforded the opportunity to shape parish development plans, grants are sought and received for upkeep of community assets and facilities, elderly residents go on outings, children playground equipment is provided and maintained, the BMX track is refurbished, and much more! But all this, of course, doesn't just happen. Volunteer councillor commitment focusing on community well-being is at its heart. Other village organisations which promote public welfare and inclusiveness are currently in need of your volunteer support as well: the village hall and youth club need management assistance and the village care & link needs drivers. Without them, the parish will not, as we say nowadays, "be in a good place". The Parish Council very much hopes you may be able to answer one of these appeals.



BMX – Fête track opening

Claire Perry MP for Devizes has graciously agreed to open the council-led refurbished BMX track on West Lavington's playing fields at 1.45 pm on Saturday, July 14th. Mrs. Perry will then open the Fête at 2pm. The surface transformation to the track with new concrete kerbing would not have been possible without the generous grant of half the cost made by the Devizes Area Board. Councillors are most grateful. We hope we will see you at the 1.45pm opening - with children and/or grandchildren! - and, of course at the Fête itself.

CHEVERELL MAGNA PARISH COUNCIL

The Council last met on 4 June. The Approved Minutes of the previous meeting (the Annual General Meeting in May) are available to see on the website, the Notice Board outside the shop, and Victoria Park. The next meeting will be on 2 July.

One of the Council vacancies has now been filled by co-option. We welcome Mrs. Kimi Porter of Weavers Mead, who has taken over a number of portfolios. However, we still have another vacancy to fill so, if you want to improve the quality of life in YOUR village, please contact the Clerk or any Councillor. It's not an onerous task, but it can be a rewarding one.

At the May meeting, Council heard the concerns of residents about the footpath network and the building plot behind The Bell Inn. These issues will be pursued with Wiltshire Council. The situation with Victoria Park continues to be of concern, with ongoing discussions between the Ministry of Justice and Wiltshire Council. The Parish Council is trying to help by offering to establish a programme of verge cutting, which will require a team of local volunteers. If you can help, please let us know ! Full safety training will be given, and funds have been set aside to buy a mower.

Wiltshire Council has finally admitted (after a lot of prompting) that the main drains in the village are blocked, especially near Holy Trinity School. These have now been jetted out, but surveys are still underway to determine if there are any collapsed areas.

Financially, the Council has just renewed its statutory insurance cover, on the same or better terms, with a new company at a considerable saving in Public Funds. With regard to closing the 2017/18 Accounts, the Council has received a very reassuring Audit Report that says all our control systems are now well established and of high quality – after all, it's YOUR money we are looking after ! We are now into the Period for the Exercise of Public Rights, which lasts up to 27 July. This gives all Parishioners the right to ask any questions about the Accounts. Full details, and all documentation, are on the Notice Boards and the website. If you want to know anything, please contact the Clerk.

So, the Council is now able to look forward. Some exciting projects are being discussed, which will be reported just as soon as know how to deliver them!

Gardeners are always curious to see what other gardeners are up to. So it was no surprise that there was a good turn out for our June meeting. Three of our committee members had kindly invited us to take a tour of their gardens. We were lucky to have a

fine evening for these garden visits.

We started with a garden that we had visited before. At that time it had recently undergone a redesign and the borders had been replanted. On this visit we were able to admire how the good design had stood the test of time. The borders had become established. The pond now had interesting margins and an abundance of wildlife. Hedging between garden rooms had become established and provided good screening and shelter. The pathways led you towards interesting focal points. The green houses and garden sheds blended easily into the overall design.

The next garden on our tour had an old orchard at the end of the garden. Here, beneath the apple trees free range hens were roaming behind an electric fence that kept the local foxes at bay. A luxuriant rambling rose hedge, divided the orchard from the vegetable garden and the lawned garden next to the house. There was an established pond kept fresh with a water pump circulation system. There was a short but interesting woodland walk. The flower borders close to the house were well stocked and full of colour. The owners confessed during our visit that they were now beginning to future proof the garden. Certainly the raised beds in the vegetable garden had higher sides than they had at a previous visit some years earlier, to make it easier to reach the plants.

The final garden on our tour had a large vegetable plot divided from the lawned garden area by a border of espaliered fruit trees . There was a large pond with aquatic plants and a delightful border. There were many well tended flower beds. And there was a borrowed landscape view to the edge of Salisbury Plain at the end of the garden. A local beekeeper had agreed to place a beehive towards the back of the garden but the bees had swarmed and on the evening of our visit the swarm was high in the boughs of a mature tree. This provided an extra talking point for our visit.

It was interesting to overhear the discussions taking place during these visits. Gardeners are always happy to share their knowledge and their plants. When certain plants were admired during the tours there were immediate offers of cuttings or plants from fellow garden club members. And there was always someone near at hand able to identify some unusual plants or shrubs.

On Tuesday 10 July we will be visiting Atworth Botanic Nursery. And on Tuesday 14 August we will be visiting Windmill Cottage for a tour of the one acre cottage garden style, wildlife friendly garden.
