

From the Rector Reflection for March

"Now is the healing time decreed for sins of heart and word and deed, when we in humble fear record the wrong that we have done the Lord." (Latin, before 12th century)

Dauntsey's School recently created Athletics' Track and planning application 18/11759/VAR

The Parish Council wishes to bring to your attention Dauntsey's School current planning application which is seeking retrospective permission to install a red-coloured synthetic athletics track, with white fencing, which has recently been built by the school on the west playing fields known as the Mercers Field. The school already has permission for a grass track on this site.

The key material planning consideration, in the application, is the impact on landscape character and visual amenity of the proposal for the red - coloured track and white fencing.

A number of concerns have been raised with West Lavington Parish Council, in particular the visual impact of this new facility on the views across the landscape of the Vale of Pewsey, notably from Strawberry Hill and the ridgeway above Market Lavington.

TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF KINGS ROAD, EASTERTON

Wiltshire Council Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 Temporary Closure of: Kings Road (Part), Easterton (Ref: TTRO 5830)

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic: Kings Road (Part), Easterton; from its junction with B3098 High Street for a distance of approximately 200 metres in a north westerly direction. To enable: Greensquare Homes LTD to carry out works on a retaining wall. Alternative route: via Kings Road (unaffected length) – Spin Hill – Parsonage Lane – B3098 High Street and vice versa. The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs. This Order will come into operation on 01 April 2019 for 6 weeks. 
OPENING FOR 2019 from Wednesday April 24th, 12 noon

The Erlestoke House Farm Shop will be re-opening for the 2019 season on Wednesday April 24th from 12 noon. We sell fresh produce - including vegetables, eggs and local honey and preserves - plus plants, wooden planters, bird boxes and feeders, and cards, all at very reasonable prices, including fresh seasonal vegetables at 50p a bag. New things for this season will include vegetable boxes, featuring a range of our fresh vegetables, and we have a new flock of ex-battery chickens to supply our very popular eggs. In addition, our delicious Guilty Pleasures cakes can be made to order, as can our range of wooden garden furniture, and we will be selling refurbished bicycles. Come along and see for yourself!

Our produce is grown, cards and wooden goods made, and bikes refurbished by the prisoners at Erlestoke, and the shop is staffed by volunteers. The Erlestoke House Farm Shop project is run by the Erlestoke House Community Interest Company (EHCIC) for the men in HMP Erlestoke, helping them to gain skills together with fully accredited NVQ qualifications, while providing a unique outlet for the results of their work. The profits from the Farm Shop are reinvested and used to buy further supplies (such as seeds and wood), which ensures that the project is self-funding. We also fund family days at the prison, when prisoners can spend time with their children.

We are easy to find on the road between Little Cheverell and Erlestoke, and there is plenty of parking. We look forward to seeing you soon!



West Lavington Village Hall

We have already mentioned the coming of our new website, now up and running (Westlavingtonvillagehall. org) which not only provides full information on booking the hall and Giles Room, but also highlights a number of initiatives we are undertaking, some of which, please support, relating to fund raising. In terms of improvements, we are conscious that anything we do should not conflict with any longer term plans we may have, so most of the facilities we have added, or will add, are in the main hall itself. For some years the stage has not been "legal" to hire and use, but we have serviced the disabled lift and are arranging for front access safe stairs, moveable, to allow people to walk up to the stage. The Giles Room has screen and projector, also available for the main hall, but we are also investigating the sound problems in the main room, with a new PA system, as well as fixed projector and screen. This will happen if we are lucky enough to obtain an Areas Board grant.

As part also of our wish to move into community activities, we are, in conjunction with Ageuk and funding from the Parish Council, intending to run free monthly coffee mornings followed by light lunch for older village people. This will run on Friday mornings, the first is booked for April 12th. More to follow, but we are looking for volunteers to help run this.

And finally, our plans for major works, including new entrance, bigger kitchen, another meeting room plus bar area, are progressing, again more later.

A MESSAGE FROM RICHARD GAMBLE

Wiltshire Councillor for The Lavingtons & Erlestoke Division
As you know, Wiltshire Council services are extensive. From my portfolio point of view, the important things are art, heritage and tourism but there are also the small matters of economic development, schools, housing, highways, public transport, waste management, strategic planning, development control, libraries, leisure centres, public protection, public health, etc.

And that's only the minor part of the budget! Most of the money goes on adult care and children's services. If you are a beneficiary, or involved with one of those areas, you know how vital they are. Some people's lives depend on them and, one day, that may include you and me. Overall, believe me, your Council Tax is well spent!

But while I think that Wiltshire Council is one of the best in the country about such services, I have to admit that some people grumble. Not you, obviously. But there are those who complain about pot-holes or payements or verges or white lines or weed control or similar matters. And the grumblers have a good point. These matters affect the quality of life and can even be risky if, for example, they impact upon road safety.

For the grumblers, and for you, I have good news! The government has given Wiltshire Council £7,358,000 to spend on Highways and associated matters and the Council has increased this to £8 million for the next financial year. So we are going to spend:

- £3,028,000 on road surfacing and patching
- £1,000,000 on footway resurfacing
- £500,000 on pothole repairs
- £400,000 on pothole patching
- £500,000 on the velocity-patcher that repairs minor roads
- £200,000 on masonry repairs to paying-slabs, kerbs and gullies
- £500,000 on verge overruns that erode the sides of roads
- £500,000 on road markings in towns
- £300,000 on road markings at rural roads and junctions
- £300.000 on road signs
- £50,000 on high friction surfaces at traffic signals and crossings
- £50,000 on pedestrian quardrails
- £30,000 on other street furniture
- £30,000 on weed removal (by hand!) in towns
- £120,000 on weed spraying in rural areas
- £30,000 on chewing gum removal
- £50,000 on graffiti removal
- £170,000 on enhanced gully emptying
- £70,000 on ditch clearing, and
- £50,000 on sweeping, especially on blossom and leaf fall.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN REFERNDUM - further delays!

I am sorry to report that further to my Parish Council Chairman's report in the February edition of News and Views that Wiltshire Council was likely to announce their decision that West Lavington's Neighbourhood Plan could proceed to Referendum in April - there are now more delays! The examination of the 'West Lavington Neighbourhood Plan 2017-2026' was completed in November 2018 when Wiltshire Council received the Examiner's Report. The Council was due to make its decision re the Referendum by 31 January 2019 and the signs were distinctly positive. However, while considering the Examiner's recommendations Wiltshire Council unexpectedly very late in the day identified the new need for them to review the Habitats Regulations Screening Assessment that they had produced in November 2017 to support West Lavington's Neighbourhood Plan and which had concluded:

.... Neighbourhood Plan would have no likely significant effects and no appropriate. assessment is currently considered necessary by Wiltshire Council as competent authority." The reason now for this revisit of the Habitats Regulations Screening Assessment, produced by Wiltshire Council for our Neighbourhood Plan in November 2017, is a European Court of Justice judgement in April 2018 which resulted in the Government enacting Regulations that came into force on 28 December 2018 and changed the process for Habitats screening assessment.

Importantly, Wiltshire Council as the ultimate decision maker on the 'making' (i.e. adoption) of any neighbourhood plan, considers that it needs to satisfy itself that due process is followed and European obligations, as incorporated into UK law, have been met.

The review has now also led to Wiltshire Council undertaking an 'Appropriate Assessment' (dealing with any significant effect at the Habitats screening stage not taking into account mitigating factors - which they did in their original assessment) and a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) (to consider any likely significant environmental effects).

To allow them to do so, Wiltshire Council propose a revised date of 29 March 2019 (replacing 31 January 2019) within which to make their decision on the recommendations in the Examiner's Report. Wiltshire Council's Appropriate Assessment and SEA go for 5 weeks consultation on Friday, 15 February. Should Wiltshire Council's decision then be for the Neighbourhood Plan to proceed to Referendum, we are informed that it should take place within 56 working days following Wiltshire Council's decision to proceed.

FOOTPATHS: Councillors have requested that any concerns relating to our extensive footpath network should be reported to the Clerk to the Parish Council and not individual councillors. She will then be able to deal with any issues between meetings.

WWI COMMEMORATIVE COPSE NAMING: The Council thanks all those who suggested names for the copse of trees that the council intends to plant near Gore Cross to commemorate our fallen First World War parishioners. The suggested name that obtained the most votes was "The Remembrance Wood".

SPRING CLEAN: The annual Great British Spring Clean will this year occur from March 22nd to April 23rd. This longer period should help us to get our local street, signs, bus shelters and playing fields ready for spring. Details will follow.

The Council last met on 4 February. The Approved Minutes of the previous meeting (in January) are available to see on the website and the Council's Notice Boards. The next meeting will be on 18 March (7.30pm at The Pavilion).

Wiltshire Council has been undertaking a series of roadworks recently, especially along the A360 towards Devizes. This has unfortunately meant that our High Street has been used as a diversion during those times. No unacceptable increase in traffic has been noted (although, of course, HGV's driving through our village is always unacceptable!) but, if you feel you have been inconvenienced, the best advice is to complain to Wiltshire Council's Highways Department.

With regard to possibly taking over areas of Public Land from Wiltshire Council, the (Parish) Council has made an application to take over the parking area outside The Bell, and is awaiting a response. A consultation exercise is underway with residents of Weavers Mead about the two areas of green space there – we've had some responses, but we'd like to receive more!

Following the recent snowfalls (now hopefully over, as it's delightfully Spring-like as I write this) the Council received some requests for gritting salt from the housing estates in the village. Unfortunately the Council does not have any stocks of salt — Wiltshire Council no longer provides it. However the Council is revising its Emergency Plan so, if there are any truly vulnerable residents, please let us know who they are so that emergency procedures can be considered under such circumstances.

Work continues on planning the new playpark. Designs and quotes have now been received from a range of suppliers, and funding sources are being evaluated. This is likely to be the subject of a presentation at our Annual Parish Meeting on 25 April. But your comments are always welcome.

Finally, the Council is keen to support the National Spring Clean, running from 22 March to 23 April. Let's tidy up Great Cheverell! Previous exercises of this nature have not been well-supported, but we're hoping that the campaigns in the national Press will generate more interest. The Council intends to run a clean-up on Saturday 23 March, with another one in mid-April if that's successful. We're considering a number of 'rewards', including bacon butties for participants! More details will be published soon around the village but, as usual, we can't do it without you, and "many hands make light work".

NEWS FROM HOLY TRINITY C OF E PRIMARY ACADEMY

Music at Holy Trinity: Our children are great music lovers and performers. It was a joy to take the whole school to Central Hall in Southampton for a wonderful orchestral experience in January. The concert was designed for children and gave them an introduction to the works of Albinoni, Rameau, Strauss and many other great

composers. The children were enchanted by the experience. We provide a variety of music lessons within the curriculum and also offer peripatetic specialist instrument tuition in piano, brass, guitar, recorder, choir, handbells and ukulele. The children enjoy performing at various school concerts and do well in the Devizes Eisteddfod with our school choir. We are supported enormously in our work to give our children a great musical education by the very generous annual donation from Edington Station Yard trustees – this enables us to continue to provide for our children the quality of musical experience which they deserve and which we would otherwise struggle to afford out of our straitened budget. We are very grateful to them.

Farming Talk: It was a real treat to have Robert King, a farmer in Edington, come to talk to our children about farming in the 21st century - a great thing to consider after our children had grown, harvested by hand, ground on a millstone and baked into bread their very own wheat last season. He told the children about the use of technology in farming, including the use of satellites and robots which help to produce our crops nowadays, and of how this technology can help protect the environment as well. We were fascinated to learn that Bob is taking part in a trial using special robots to look after crops – this technology is being developed in our own area but will eventually be used across the country and indeed the world. We are always very grateful for the support of our local community in helping to educate our children especially in these specialist areas.

Fire!: As well as having the fire service in school to talk to our children about fire safety this month, we also took our two younger classes to Salisbury to the fire station there. They got to watch some model Tudor Houses being burnt (as part of their Fire of London topic) and used the fire hose – what an experience! They then went to Salisbury cathedral, and to Salisbury museum to find out about the history of firefighting through the ages. We are very fortunate that our families support us so strongly in our work to take children out on field trips – nearly all our families will help us pay for the coaches and entry tickets, so that we are able to afford to take the children to exciting places.



At the start of our meeting we had a timely reminder from our chairman about our forthcoming annual plant sale in May. Members were encouraged when planting seeds to put in a few extra to produce plants for donation to the plant sale. Then the speaker, Terry

Baker from the Botanic Nursery at Atworth, was introduced.

Local garden nurseries usually know what plants are suitable for local soils. And when there is an enthusiast for a particular species of plant running a nursery it makes sense to go to them to purchase that plant. The Botanic Nursery in Atworth is well known for its foxglove collection. But at our February meeting we learned that the owner Terry Baker is also a self confessed compulsive propagator of trees. As a result he has a great collection of trees and and is very knowledgeable on the subject of trees. Using photographs of his own trees at the Nursery, and also trees in parks , gardens and arboretums where he has acted as a consultant, he waxed lyrical on the subject of 'Trees for the garden'.

During the evening he spoke about a selection of trees and by describing the leaves fruits, seeds, flowers and scents gave us some ideas about what to choose for our own gardens. In his definition of trees he included some shrubs which had lower branches removed to concentrate the growth on a single or a few stems. He tended to use the Latin names for everything and not the common names. Terry does buy in root stock but all his trees are propagated by him and none are bought in from suppliers. This means that trees he sells will be used to a limestone rich soil and will be likely to be hardy to the local climate.

At the end of the talk there were questions from the audience. In answering these questions Terry once again demonstrated his immense experience and knowledge.

To the delight of the audience Terry and his wife had brought in lots of plants for sale at the end of the evening. These included some of their famous foxgloves and some hellebores.

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 12 March. The topic will be 'Interesting bulbs'. Gill Hazel who runs the Great Western Gladiolus Nursery, where they specialise in gladioli, but also have unusual bulbs from South Africa, will be the speaker. Meet at Great Cheverell Village Hall at 7.15 for a 7.30pm start.

We have a varied and interesting programme for 2019 with talks on a wide range of topics, and some garden visits. We meet on the second Tuesday of each month. New members are always welcome. Our annual subscription is just £10 per person or £18 for a double membership. The charge for non members is £2 per meeting.

The Joy of Les Miserables

My mum has seen the musical version of *Les Miserables* twice. It's one of the longest running productions on the West End. Apparently, the show has been seen by 70 million people in 52 countries and 22 languages around the world. I saw the film of the musical when it came out a few years ago. But it was only in watching the BBC's recently screened *Les Miserables* that the power of the drama really came home to me. If you missed it, you can probably still catch it on BBC iPlayer. The story follows the twists and turns in the life of Jean Valjean, a convict who became a respectable businessman. The prison chief, Javert did not believe that it was possible for Valjean to come good. He vowed to hunt him down when he was released from jail.

As a former convict, Valjean could find nowhere to lay his head until a kindly bishop gave a bed for the night. True to form, Valjean stole the bishop's silverware and headed off into the night. The police hunted him down and were about to force the thief return what he had taken from the bishop. Then something unexpected happened. The police wanted Valjean to face justice. Back to the prison hulks. But the bishop did more than show mercy; forgive the thief and let him off. He gave Valjean two silver candlesticks, explaining to the police that he must have forgotten them when he left in the night. That was a moment of grace.

Such grace is a rare thing in today's world. Look at what happened after Liam Neeson confessed to revenge fantasies the other week. Yes, what he thought about doing was wrong. He said as much himself. But many were quick to pounce on his remarks and label the actor as an unforgiveable racist. Social media has turned us into merciless little Javerts for whom there is no conception of grace and no hope of redemption for those who have done wrong.

With grace there is always hope, for grace gives us what we don't deserve. Valjean certainly didn't deserve a second chance. He knew it, and the grace shown him by the bishop turned his life around. That's the joy of *Les Miserables*. The Christian faith is all about grace. God sent Jesus to satisfy the demands of justice by dying for our sins upon the cross. In his mercy, God offers us forgiveness for the wrong things we have done. Grace goes beyond even that. Those who believe in Jesus are welcomed into God's family and given the hope of eternal life. In the BBC drama, when Valjean lay dying, his eyes were fixed on the silver candlesticks given him by the bishop. Grace enabled him to die in peace.


